

#### Churchyard Team update

#### What's in a bench?

Benches are a place of rest, relaxation and somewhere to contemplate life. They can be a place for conversation, picnics, exercise, reading or writing.

For children, it's a place of imaginative play, from being the captain of a ship, driving a bus to climbing a mountain or jumping on top of crocodiles. For others its simply somewhere to colour a picture and do paper rubbing.

The most common places you will find a

bench will be found at bus stop, a park, a train station, and the sea front. It wasn't until recently I learned that Churches didn't have any seating except for around the odd pillar, and it wasn't until the late 13<sup>th</sup> century that seating was introduced

in the form of benches. More information is available on the CofE website - www.churchofengland.org, search for "seating guidance".

In churchyards we see benches that are in memory of loved ones who have passed. They give us an opportunity to be with and to remember them.

TMBC have produced a leaflet (how to sponsor a seat) about the different types of benches that can be sponsored, where they can placed, along with who is responsible for them. In this case it is the responsibility of the council to look after the benches and maintain them, however if it is deemed that the bench has been seriously damaged or deteriorated though age, they cannot guarantee the bench

will be replaced.

In the case of having a bench in the churchyard an application must be made to the Faculty (a permissive right to undertake works to a church building or its contents) a decision is made at the time of the application as to where the bench will go. But who is responsible for them?

Often the people who have purchased the seat will maintain it. When this doesn't happen the Churchyard team try to make good a bench

where possible. In the case of this past year we have been sanding and varnishing those benches that have been weathered in an attempt to keep them going for a few more years. Similarly to the TMBC regulations, it states that if a bench has become seriously damaged or

unrepairable, then we will not be able to replace it.

The Churchyard team rely on ongoing donations for projects like this; without this support we wouldn't be able to create such a nice place.

We now have 10 volunteers who come on a weekly or monthly basis to help maintain the grounds. You do not have to live in the village and there is no specific qualification, just a readiness to turn up, and be part of a team. If anyone is interested, please do contact me via the office or

#### Hildenborough Cricket Club

Richard Sparks scored Hildenborough's first hundred for two years. He hit 17 fours and two sixes off just 63 balls in the 46-run win at Brasted Invicta. Sparks retired on 100 not out - Mark Davies the last to reach the milestone, following his undefeated 103 against Stonewall Park in June 2022. Davies hit 31 and Greg Smith 32 with Dean Sands 23 not out at the end, in a total of 231-3, including 42 extras. Sands followed up with 2-18 - five other bowlers taking a wicket apiece as Invicta finished on 185-8.

Barry Webb's 53 top scored as Hildenborough totalled 201 all out at Horsmonden. Sands, Mark Skinner and Dave Robertshaw all claimed two wickets to help dismiss the hosts for 177 to win by 24 runs.

Greg Smith hit 46 and Tim Walford 44 as Hildenborough made 158-5 in a 20 over-a-side contest at Chevening. The home side recovered from 52-4 to reach 155-4 to finish three runs short.

Tight bowling by Webb and Sands at the end left the home side needing 12 off the last overthe latter conceding only eight in his only over to set-up the narrow win in a tight contest. Hildenborough's first home game was ended by rain. Cowdrey Cricket Club's Development



X1 stepped in to fill the gap as original opponents Lamorbey Park pulled out. They made 128-8 in a reduced 25 overs -Hildenborough reaching 28-2 before the weather proved the only winner. Late runs by Barry Webb and Dougie Gartshore just failed to earn Hildenborough victory at Wrotham. They needed 60 off the final five overs - Webb hitting 29 not out off 17 balls, and Gartshore chipping in with an unbeaten 23 off 11 proving a valiant but vain effort as the visitors finished 12 runs short. Steve Waite with 53 - his first half century for the club, and Tim Walford's 40 kept things ticking over earlier replying to Wrotham's 217 -2 off 35 overs Sonny Williams on his debut claimed one of

the wickets.

Firstly, thank you to those who emailed following last month's article – it was so lovely to hear that you had been out in the garden with a pair of snips and able to bring a small

piece of the outdoors in to enjoy.

Writing this in mid-July, it seems in the distant past that we were treated to a week of warm, summer weather at the end of June. In classic British summer style, the sun promptly disappeared, and it has been unusually wet and cold since.

But – all is not lost! My roses this year have been phenomenal – even those I planted as bare roots over winter have produced amazing, plentiful blooms.

Now is a great time to take cuttings and produce new plants for next year. Simple to do – snip approx. 8-10inches of a soft wood stem, just below a leaf node. Trim it at the top just above a leaf node and remove any thorns and larger leaves. Pop into some well-draining compost (you can dip it in rooting hormone first, should you wish) and keep it watered well. By next spring, the cutting will have rooted and be ready to go in the ground.

I am absolutely obsessed with my David Austin roses – Generous Gardener, Gertrude Jackyll and Princess Alexandra of Kent being my current favourites. The scent of all of the above is exquisite and I am truly mesmerised by watching how they change colour and shape as they develop. Cut at the right time, traditional garden roses will last in a vase for 3 or 4 days. They make the most perfect flowers for weddings and events – blousy, elegant and so romantic. Multiple buds at different stages of development on one rambling stem, adding interest as well as a very natural feel.

If you don't cut your roses to enjoy indoors, make sure you do dead head them. Many varieties will produce a second flush of

flowers later in the summer if you do. Why not collect the dead heads and dry the petals – I use these of course for a natural, biodegradable confetti for my wedding couples but there are so many other uses including potpourri, dressing food, making beauty products and rosewater. Simply Google what to do with your petals for inspiration!



Following the second flush of flowers, I will leave some of my dead heads to develop into hips – Generous Gardener is a great one for this. For me, the hips act as small jewels adding autumnal interest to designs but again, there are so many uses – rose hip wine being the one that springs instantly to mind!

To ensure great growth in the following year, pruning and mulching is always


recommended. The RHS website is fantastic and will give you specific advice how to care for your roses depending on whether they are shrubs, climbers and so on.

### The Night Sky in Hildenborough – August 2024

The summer solstice is just a distant memory which is why you may have noticed that it now gets dark earlier than it did previously. In fact, on the 1<sup>st</sup> August the Sun sets 33 minutes earlier than it did on the night of the solstice and by 31<sup>st</sup> August it sets 1 hour 32 minutes earlier. Of course, the Sun also rises later in the morning so we lose some daylight from the other end of the day as well. On the day of the solstice, we had 16 hours 35 minutes and 43 seconds of daylight but by the end of August that has fallen to 13 hours 35 minutes and nine seconds. Winter is coming!

Throughout August all the planetary action, with the exception of Saturn, takes place in the morning sky which is inconvenient for the majority.

At the beginning of the month Saturn rises, close to the east, at 10:15pm, though most us will have to wait for it to clear obstructions on the horizon. By month's end it rises soon after sunset and sits 25° high and almost exactly south east at 11pm. Next month promises an improvement for the ringed planet as it gradually brightens whilst marking the start of a return of the brightest planets to the evening sky and not a moment too soon.

August brings the return of one of the year's strongest meteor showers, the Perseids. The shower is active from 17<sup>th</sup> July until 24<sup>th</sup> August but only attracts public attention when activity reaches a peak which occurs this year on the evening of 12<sup>th</sup> August. For the rest of the 5 weeks or so, meteor numbers

are just a few per hour and hardly likely to grab the headlines. However, in the case of the Perseids, the period of maximum activity can be measured in terms of hours when meteor numbers rise considerably. When astronomers predict numbers, they use a formula that suggests what the rate will be if the radiant (the point in the sky where the meteors appear to radiate from) were overhead and the sky conditions were perfect - both highly unlikely. Having got that prediction we then scale it down to what experience tells us is more likely and, in this case, I think we could reasonably expect to see one meteor every two or three minutes. This year the first quarter Moon sets at 10:50pm on the 12<sup>th</sup> although it would be worthwhile looking as soon as it gets dark.

The diagram (right hand page) shows the sky at 11pm and gives several star groups (the "W" of Cassiopeia and the Square of Pegasus) to aid identification. The bright star, Capella and the planet Saturn are also marked. The small circle with an "R" at the centre indicates where the meteors will appear to radiate from. However, looking at the radiant is not necessary or advisable as the meteors closest to the radiant tend to be shorter. Better results are obtained by looking away from the radiant either towards the Square of Pegasus or towards the Plough which is in the north west.

The best way to observe is by lying on a sun lounger or something similar with it pointing either east or north with the head end raised slightly. It's surprising how much sky you can be aware of and watch at one time. Using



the sun lounger allows you to see up towards the zenith (overhead point) as well.

## T.M.B.C. News

#### From Cllr Rhodes:

#### B245 Waterleak.

My Mum always used to say, 'Self praise is no praise', but I will stick a feather in my hat for this one. The water leak on the B245 between the Flying Dutchman and the main entrance to the Oakhill development had been apparent for quite a while. With the imminent resurfacing of the B245 by KCC, I decided to ring South East Water, I actually managed to speak to someone and suggested robustly, that they ought to get on and repair the leak before the re-surfacing as KCC would take a dim view of the road being dug up again so soon. I would like to think, my phone call did the trick.

#### **Energy Plans.**

The Council has received funding for more roof mounted Solar Panels, (£393,000) and LED lighting (£12,039) at Larkfield Leisure centre. The Public Sector Decarbonisation Scheme awarded the Council £1.1M for the installation of air source heat pumps to serve the fitness pool. Tonbridge pool has benefited with the installation of 150 solar panels (£110,000) these should generate approx 65,000kWHs. LED lighting has also been installed at the pool. Before the solar panels can be installed at Larkfield, the roof is to be re-covered over the existing covering, in addition extra insulation and a fire rated board are to be included to satisfy the Council's insurers.

#### TMBC Productivity Plan.

Councils across the country were asked to produce productivity plans as part of a drive towards improving productivity in Local Government. Councils were asked; 1) How they have transformed the way they design and deliver services to make better use of resources. 2) How they plan to take advantage of technology and make better use of data to improve decision making, service design and use of resources. 3) Their plans to reduce wasteful spend within their organisation and systems. 4) The barriers preventing progress that the Government can help to reduce or remove. If you would like to see a copy of the TMBC PP please contact me.

#### Motions.

The TMBC constitution, allows for motions to be brought before full Council meetings for debate, from any political party. However, some past motions that have been presented have had nothing to do with Council responsibility. The constitution has now been amended so that motions are to be about matters that the Council is involved in or affect the Borough.

#### **Council Meetings.**

Please remember Council meetings are still streamed on You Tube, however public attendance is permitted in the Council Chamber.



Here we are in late summer and having just recovered from all the excitement of England doing so well in the Euros, we now have the Olympics to enjoy. If you are feeling inspired to take up a sport, we are fortunate to have some fantastic sporting amenities here in Hildenborough. The Recreation Ground. owned and maintained by the Parish Council, is host to Hildenborough Cricket Club and the Stoolball Club who have both been enjoying the spacious grounds and the facilities available in the pavilion. The Recreation Ground is also the home of Hildenborough Tennis Club, and the ball court, which has been very popular with youngsters during these long summer evenings. There is also the outside gym equipment adjacent to the playground that is free to use and conveniently close to the car park. The Parish Council is arranging for the initial survey to be carried out in the Recreation Ground in preparation for moving forward with the installation of a footpath around its perimeter, so I'm sure that will be popular with those wishing to start their day with an early morning jog around the Rec!

#### Highways

At the time of writing this article, Kent Highways are in the process of resurfacing the B245, which will make a huge difference to motorists, apart from also improving the appearance of the road. Thankfully, South

East Water came and fixed the leak in the middle of the road, close to The Flying Dutchman, just in time for the road to be resurfaced. Failing infrastructure means that water companies are struggling to keep up with the repair work, but I understand they will prioritise those leaks that are complained about the most, so reporting a leak that may already have been reported will hopefully speed things up. Water leaks should be reported to South East Water, the suppliers of Hildenborough's fresh water. Their number is 0333 000 0365. Blocked drains and flooding should be reported to Southern Water, who look after removal of waste water and sewerage. Their number is 0330 303 0277. Please remember to have the postcode of the location of the fault ready if you call them. In addition to reporting a problem to the water company, please feel free to also notify the parish council, who can add their voice to the requests to fix the issue as soon as possible. The Parish Council was recently granted permission to install a banner saying: "30mph - IT'S A LIMIT, NOT A TARGET" on the B245 adjacent to Foxbush. We hope this will be an effective reminder for motorists who are breaking the speed limit as they enter the 30mph zone. In the meantime, the Parish Council are working with Kent Highways to explore other traffic calming measures that can be introduced in the Village. Kent Highways are currently investigating the feasibility of introducing double yellow lines

along the stretch of London Road opposite the Harvest garage where there are frequently parked vehicles blocking the pavement. The presence of a Southern Water pumping station that requires 24 hour access further complicates matters but hopefully a solution can be found very soon.



#### Tales from the Graveyard: The Railway Men

Visitors to the churchyard may be puzzled by a rather smart Gravestone between the path and the carpark. The Gravestone looks old, but the inscription is newly carved. This is a story of a tragedy that united the community.

The plaque commemorates an incident on the 1<sup>st</sup> April in 1898 when two railway workers were killed while working on the track near Hildenborough Station, where the line is in a cutting. *Tonbridge Free Press* described the event as a shock to the whole village. At that time the village was a small close-knit community with the victims, George Upton

and James Goldsmith, well known. The two men were platelayers, railway men who maintained the railway. At that time the railway was a dangerous place to work. There were many fatal accidents on the railway. In that year alone there were 648 accidents recorded, this did not include this accident in Hildenborough. On Friday 1<sup>St</sup> April, a gang of platelayers were at work on the South-Eastern Railway between Tonbridge & Hildenborough, two of them, George Upton and James Goldsmith in order to avoid an

"up" train, got onto the opposite rails, not seeing or hearing an approaching "down" train due to the line curving through the cutting and the noise of the steam engine. Both were killed instantly. A third member of the team was foreman George Goldsmith, who witnessed the accident but had been unable to warn the men.

George Goldsmith was a well-known longtime resident of Hildenborough. He had lost a son. At the time his family consisted of his wife Ann and 8 other children who lived at Flat Cottages (now the site of Brookside Garage).

George Alex Upton (born c1868) and his wife Myra Jane Upton lived with Myra's brother and his family at Sewage Farm, Tonbridge at the time of the 1891 Census. Myra had a son, William George, just five at the time of the accident. She was expecting her second child (later named Alex John). At the time of the 1901 census, Myra is living in her own home in Hildenborough with her two sons. In 1904 Alex was a prize winner at the School in

Riding Lane (just a few yards from his home). The two Upton boys served in World War 1 and survived the war. The 1918 Absent Voter List for Hildenborough shows 2 Upton entries; William George (there are no details of his regiment), and Alex John was in the Middlesex Regiment. As a consequence of the accident, the 2 men were buried in a joint grave at St John's churchyard. The village held a collection which paid for the headstone and a plaque at Hildenborough Station. Over 150 donations were received. By 2016

the gravestone was in a sad way and Hildenborough History Society collected funds to enable the gravestone to be replaced. The response was similar to the original appeal and on 16<sup>th</sup> July Judith Upton (great granddaughter of George) unveiled the restored headstone. (A group photo taken at the same time shows 12 members of the extended family).

#### CHILDCARE ACCOUNTS CAN SUBSIDISE SUMMER CHILDCARE COSTS

If you have children under 12 who attend a nursery, after school club, playscheme or childminder, or you are considering sending them to a summer camp, you should think about setting up a tax-free childcare account. The government adds 25% to the amounts that you save in the account - up to £2,000 for each child - so £8,000 is topped up to £10,000

(a higher amount applies if a child is disabled).

The account is then used to pay Ofsted registered childcare providers. Note that it doesn't need to be the child's parents paying into the account; Uncles, Aunts, Grandparents and others can also make payments, The government have noticed that

many families who are eligible for this scheme are yet to set up their accounts, so if you are an employer you could bring this to the attention of your staff to increase the take up.

Note that parents are not eligible if either of them have adjusted net income in excess of £100,000 for the current tax year.
