From the Church

Robert Cumming was not the first art critic to be puzzled by Filippino Lippi's famous 15th century painting Virgin and Child. He stared at the picture for long periods of time, trying to understand the deeper meaning the artist was trying to convey. Baffled, he was convinced he was missing the deeper message of the artwork.

The picture depicts Mary cradling the infant Jesus on her knee with two saints, Dominic and Jerome, praying in the foreground. But the picture's perspective appeared all wrong. The hills in the background look as if they might topple out of the picture, Jerome and Dominic seemed awkward and uncomfortable, and Mary seemed to be staring at no one in particular. Nothing appeared right and there was no explanation. Many critics had thought that this picture was flawed and the picture was at first considered one his worst pieces of art.

Cumming had a revelation, he realised that the painting was never meant to hang in a gallery, but was intended by the artist as an aid to prayer. Lippi then understood that those trying to get the true meaning of the picture needed to be kneeling and looking upwards, and it was when Cumming fell to his knees, only then did the picture come alive, he finally saw the details of the picture in its true perspective.

Too often we make a similar mistake. We view God from our perspective. It's only when we are willing to fall on our knees in humility before Him, that we see Him as He truly is. If God truly created everything, then we come before Him in awe and wonder.

Awe because God made all things. Wonder, that in all the things God made, He sees humankind as worthy of being made in His own image.

The final thing God created was human beings, the crown of His creation. God's intention for all human kind was that they would know Him deep in their hearts and souls. In that intimate place or sacred connection. Humanity would know God's incredible love for themselves. From that place of love and closeness with God, life would be experienced in its fullest dimension. God created people to walk daily with Him. Sadly, this as we know is not the case for all people. God gives free will for people to accept His love or turn away from Him. Love never forces itself on another. Jesus came to reveal God to humankind and to let them know God was reaching out to them through the life and teaching of Jesus Himself. Only through Jesus can people know God truly for themselves.

I wonder if you have ever thought about how much God loves you?

As you read this, know that God is reaching out to you at this moment and the bible says when a person meets with God for the first time the whole of heaven celebrates. Why not ask Him to reveal Himself to you. What have you got to lose? You do have everything to gain and an eternity in heaven with God.







For me personally, it has become a time of reflection, contemplation and a lot of prayer.... for the hard work that had been achieved, the people willing to help, and to the people who took the equipment.

This story has a better ending as amazingly enough when all seems lost, miracles happen! Farmers' Market Recipe for June: Toad in the hole

Ingredients 12 chipolatas

1 tbsp sunflower oil

For the batter 140g plain flour 2 eggs 175ml semi-skimmed milk

Method

1.Heat the oven to 220C/200C fan/gas 7. Put the chipolatas in a 20 x 30cm roasting

tin with the oil and bake for 15 mins until browned.

2.Meanwhile, make the batter. Tip the flour into a bowl with ½ tsp salt, make a well in the middle and crack the eggs into it. Use an electric whisk to mix it together, then slowly add the milk, whisking all the time. Leave to stand until the sausages are nice and brown.

3.Remove the sausages from the oven – be careful because the fat will be sizzling hot – but if it isn't, put the tin on the hob for a few minutes until it is.

4.Pour in the batter mix, transfer to the top shelf of the oven, then cook for 25-30 mins, until risen and golden. Serve with gravy and your favourite veg.

The Night Sky in Hildenborough – June 2024

There is a degree of relief for observers now that the planets are gradually appearing in the morning sky as they begin to move out of the solar glare. On 1st June, Mars is in the east at an altitude of 8° along with Saturn, that lies slightly closer to the south east. A crescent Moon can be found between them. By the end of the month, Saturn is more prominent, just past south east, and almost 30° above the horizon. The thought of leaving the comfort of bed at 3 or 4 am to see them may be enough to persuade all but the hardiest to wait for the longer nights which incidentally will soon arrive following the summer solstice on 20th June. The change occurs very gradually at first but by the last day of the month the difference in the amount of daylight will be approximately 53 seconds less than the previous day.

During June both Mercury and Venus move into the evening sky although they are currently too close to the Sun for identification. Venus remains a difficult object to locate until later in the year whilst Mercury was at its best for 2024 back in late March. There is a chance to see it in the evenings in July but it will always be close to the horizon when care must be taken to ensure the Sun has set if using optical aid to search for it.

Our old friend the Plough (part of the constellation Ursa Major) is high up in the north west in the evenings with the end star

in its tail/handle less than 10° from the zenith or overhead point. It is making its way back down towards the northern horizon although it will never set from our latitudes and is therefore termed "circumpolar". This term refers to objects that are close enough to the north celestial pole (marked by the pole star, Polaris) to always remain visible. The more you travel southwards towards the Earth's equator, the lower in the sky the Plough becomes until, when you reach the equator, you have the north and south celestial poles on opposite horizons. You would be in the enviable position, if you stayed there all year, of having seen the entire night sky at some point in time.

The north celestial pole is marked by the unspectacular star, Polaris, the Pole Star. People tend to think that the pole star must be the brightest and most significant star in the night sky but this isn't the case at all. The fact that it occupies the location it does is nothing more than pure coincidence. Incidentally, our fellow astronomers in the southern hemisphere have no obvious star to mark the position of their celestial pole.

When I said that Polaris marks the position of the pole, that wasn't strictly true. To be more precise Polaris is just over ½° from the true celestial pole although it serves its purpose admirably as a quick, if not truly accurate, indicator of north. Polaris hasn't always been the pole star thanks to

something called precession. If you imagine viewing the Earth, with its axis of rotation extended into space a short distance, you would see each of the poles describe a circle in the sky which would take just under 26,000 years to complete. Polaris, as well as a number of other stars, lie on, or close to, that circle so at some time in the past and future the Earth's north pole will point at them.

This type of precession is more commonly referred to as the precession of the equinoxes. This is because, as well as the location of the pole changing, the point in the sky where the Sun lies at the moment of an equinox also moves at the same rate. This gradual motion over so many years is caused by the gravitational attraction of the Sun and Moon acting on the equatorial bulge of the Earth, a statement that may lead you to ask why the Earth isn't a perfect sphere.

The answer is that it tends to form an oblate spheroid, so that it bulges at the equator and flattens across the poles, thanks to the centrifugal force caused by the planet rotating. The oblateness of the Earth only amounts to an additional 43km around the equator, but Jupiter, that rotates in just 10 hours and generates a much stronger centrifugal force, measures an extra 9,250 kilometres around its equator compared to around its poles. To put that into context, Jupiter's equatorial circumference is 439,260 kilometres.

T.M.B.C. News

Castle Car Park.

TMBC Cabinet, were persuaded to abandon plans to extend the Upper Castle Fields car park by 28 spaces. I can remember a time when there was only green grass covering the whole area. In fact, as a pupil of Slade School, (67/68) we were taken to that area one afternoon and we played until home time. It occurred to me the other day the reason we went there was because the then, TUDC (Tonbridge Urban) wanted to construct the car park that is there now.

Footpath.

The footpath that runs from the end of Leybank, is unfortunately in a sorry state. Communication with KCC to improve the surface does continue. It would seem however options are limited, without spending a vast sum of money. You might be aware of St Andrews Church in Hadlow Road (the small green building). Next to the Church is a footpath, that was in a similar state. Over a couple of weekends, volunteers man-handled with shovels and wheelbarrows about 10 tons of MOT road base over most of the length of the path - it was spread with rakes and rolled. Suffice to say that now the path has returned to its near original condition. The road base has sunk sub surface from the impact of footpath users.

LFSA Barrier.

The Environment Agency (EA) has extended invites to the Barrier to members. Work is progressing now and due to security fencing access is limited. On site, viewing of the barrier is only permitted on the upstream side. The barrier system will be raised by 600mm, so the water volume behind the barrier can increase by 7.3M Cubic metres, requiring an extra 16 hectares. Bentonite Clay is being used during these works. I believe the Hildenborough bund will also be constructed with Bentonite. Downstream

from the barrier Open Stone Asphalt Erosamat Geotextile Layer has been used to strengthen the river banks. Included in the new works is an eel pass. The picture shows the barrier middle gate open from the upstream side.



Gatwick.

Several Councils were invited to attend a Discover Gatwick Presentation: I attended with another member from Tonbridge. Gatwick would like to start using the North taxiway for take offs, by adding 6m wide of concrete to its north side, this then enables the centre line to be moved. For 2023, 40.9m passengers passed through, (46.6m 2019) there were 256,000 aircraft movements (280,000 2019) and there are now 56 airlines using Gatwick, up from 54. Aircraft noise of course is never far from the discussion: Gatwick use 22 noise monitors, two are positioned 20 miles away from each end of the main runway. If you search 'Gatwick WebTrak' you can access a live map of the area as planes approach. We were given an airside visit after security, belts off, phones in the box etc. The amount of snow clearing plant sitting not being used is phenomenal and it did not get much use last winter.

The Seat.

Unfortunately, the metal seat outside the Vicarage was removed. My grateful thanks to a number of people who at least tried to get it repaired.

Persistent offenders may receive further enforcement action from the police.

With the introduction of these new sites, the Hildenborough Community Speedwatch team is seeking dedicated volunteers to join their friendly team. Sparing just an hour or two or so can make a significant impact on road safety in Hildenborough. 


May's litter pick was a triumph!







The Parish Council held its Annual Parish Council Meeting on Wednesday 8th May, when Cllr Ioannis Sklavenitis was appointed as the new Chair and Cllr Karen Dobson was appointed as Vice-Chair. Other members of the council were appointed to various committees.

West Wood

Sarah from Medway Countryside Partnership visited the pond in West Wood last month, to carry out her three-month check to see how the pond was faring following its renovation. The project is primarily to create a suitable habitat for the endangered Great Crested Newt, but, as Sarah found, a wide variety of other pond creatures are also benefiting from the project.

After her inspection, Sarah said: "The pond is full of life at last, whereas before there was none after a pond dip. Today I found, pond skater, water beetle and water beetle larvae, phantom midge larvae, daphnia, water shrimp, bloodworm, water boatman and backswimmer. There is also some marsh marigold growing around the edges". Sarah said that the orange fencing at the pond should stay in place for at least another couple of months as the silt is still very wet in places and the site in general is very muddy. A professional Risk Assessment was undertaken recently to see whether safety measures are necessary. Once the warm summer sunshine has dried out the silt, the pond will be a

delightful place to visit later this year.

The Recreation Ground

The grass has been cut and sporting activities are finally resuming at the Recreation Ground, following the wettest spring on record. The pounding of hundreds of feet during the Hildenborough Road Race on 6th May churned the ground up in places as it was pouring with rain for the event, but the field is recovering quickly now the warmer weather is here. Despite the weather, there was still a record-breaking turn out of runners for the Road Race and the organisers were delighted with the success of this year's event. At last month's Annual Parish Council Meeting, councillors decided to seek a qualified consultant to assist with putting together a specification for the proposed new footpath around the perimeter of the Rec. The footpath will be funded by \$106 monies from Berkeley Homes and the investment in professional advice should ensure the footpath

will be cost-effective but at the same time, long-lasting for future generations to enjoy. It is a major project for the Parish Council, who is always mindful of using its budget wisely on behalf of Hildenborough residents.

Police

Hildenborough's local Beat Officer, PC Ollie Evans, has reported that from 3rd April to 3rd May there were 12 crimes reported in Hildenborough, six of them related to theft. Ollie stopped two males who were in the process of stealing motorbikes, and he arrested both of them for going equipped for theft and it is expected they will be charged. Ollie said that four of the crimes were very much opportunistic and he would like to remind residents to keep property out of sight and secure. He said residents would be wise not to leave vehicles unattended in very rural locations overnight. He would also like to encourage residents to continue to report any suspicious behaviour/ vehicles to Kent Police and/or the Parish Council. There was a previous issue with motorbikes being stolen from the railway station but after multiple arrests this appears to have calmed. Ollie said he is working with the Neighbourhood Task Force to continue to tackle any drug use in the area but any reports of drug use at the Recreation Ground are few and far between.

Highways

As of Friday 10th May, the "wigwags" (flashing warning lights) in Riding Lane are being programmed to operate at the start and end of the school day to help slow

traffic down as it approaches Hildenborough CE Primary School.

The obstructive parking across the pavement on London Road, opposite the Harvester Garage, is forcing pedestrians into the busy road. The Parish Council has been liaising with the police, landowner, borough, and county council to try and resolve the issue and at the Annual Parish Council Meeting in May, it was agreed that the painting of double yellow lines onto the highway to prevent parking would be explored with Tonbridge and Malling Borough Council and Kent County Council.

Tragedy at Powder Mills. The story of William Gorham.

Imagine my surprise when I was browsing through old local newspapers in Tonbridge Library when, in a newspaper dated August 1918, I came across this report under the headline:

"FACTORY EXPLOSION AT THE POWDER MILLS AT 7AM."

It was a report of an Inquest into the death of William Gorham aged 40 leaving a widow,

Kate. They had been married for three years and had two sons William and Roland. Roland had married and lived in West Ealing . He had died in 1912 aged 30. His Father, Alexander also

worked at the factory.

The Newspaper

reported on the

Gun Power in barrels was transported from the works along canals which can still be seen in the Country Park.

inquest where evidence was given that two men were working in the hut at the time of explosion. The hut was completely demolished. The other man Henry James Balchin, was aged 47 and unmarried. The funeral was at St. John's and the remains of the men were buried in the same grave. At this time World War 1 was drawing to an

At this time World War 1 was drawing to an end but there was still a huge demand for

gunpowder to keep the guns firing. The Powder Mills at Leigh had never been so busy. Work continued round the clock to meet demand. They produced a fine grade of gunpowder that had many uses from charges for rifle bullets to barrel loads of gunpowder to be hidden under enemy trenches to be detonated to blow a gap in the enemy trenches as the army pushed forwards.

The Powder Mills buildings were designed to limit the possibility of an explosion but accidents still happened. The huts where the powder was made were spaced out so that an explosion would have a limited

effect. Even the workers homes were designed with no

windows or doors on the factory side of the house to limit the damage an accident would cause. The men knew that theirs was a dangerous job and their safety deepened on keeping to the rules. There were very few accidents reported in the local papers.

A new digital service has been launched that makes it easier to check if you have any gaps in your National Insurance (NI) record that may affect your State Pension entitlement.

The service is called Check Your State Pension forecast and can be accessed via GOV.UK or the HMRC app. You will need to register for or login to your Personal Tax Account to find the service.

The forecast details your NI record by

tax year and identifies if there are any years that are not counting towards your State Pension entitlement. The service also shows the details of any voluntary NI contributions that you could make to increase your forecast.

The service allows you to choose which years you would like to pay voluntary contributions for and then takes you through to a secure payment facility to make payment. If you think you may have gap

years in your contributions, it is

important to check sooner rather than later. Because of new State Pension transitional arrangements, the deadline for paying voluntary NI contributions was extended to 5 April 2025. Currently, it is possible to make voluntary contributions for tax years going back to 6 April 2006. However, from 6 April 2025, it will only be possible to make voluntary contributions for the preceding six years.
