From the Church



On 4th October the Church remembers St. Francis of Assisi who modelled a life of simplicity and compassion.

St. Francis of Assisi is one of

the most revered saints in Christian history. He is celebrated for his profound love for God, nature, and all living beings. Born Giovanni di Pietro di Bernardone in 1181 in Assisi, Italy, Francis transformed from a wealthy merchant's son into a humble servant of Christ, embodying the essence of Christian discipleship through his life and teachings.

Francis' early life was marked by wealth and privilege. However, after a series of lifealtering events, including a period of illness and a military experience, he began to question the meaning of life and the value of material possessions. 

From our MP: Tom Tugendhat

At the very end of July, the new Government announced plans which would significantly change planning rules, and how the location for new homes is decided.

Sadly, the approach of the Government to rip up planning laws in rural areas such as ours means the greenbelt will be torn up in many places.

I am committed to increasing the supply of housing, but we can do this in a different way. Our green spaces are an invaluable part of the national inheritance for our children, and our children's children - when it's gone, it's gone.

Building the right homes in the right places means that where there is higher demand in cities, logically the concentration of new homes should be built there.

The new Government's plan sees the housing target for Tonbridge and Malling Borough Council increase by 29%.

Representing parts of Tonbridge and Malling Borough Council and Sevenoaks District

Council, I have calculated that the new Government are asking our area to deliver nearly 1,000 more new homes each year, on top of the existing targets. Yet while this is requested in our area London is seeing its housing target reduce and neighbouring Councils such as Medway also see a reduction.

That's why I support our Council in leading the opposition to these proposed changes. We need new housing in towns and cities, while ensuring rural areas can preserve their character, development only takes place where there is appropriate infrastructure, and community consent is upheld.

FARMERS' MARKET RECIPE

Quick Tomato Chutney

If you have lots of tomatoes in your greenhouse then give this recipe a try:

Ingredients

1 tbsp olive oil

½ shallot, chopped

11/2 medium-large tomatoes, chopped

1 garlic clove, crushed

1 tbsp balsamic vinegar

1 tsp brown sugar

Method

- 1. Heat the oil in a small pan over a medium heat.
- 2. Add the shallots, tomatoes and garlic and cook for 5–8 minutes or until softened.
- 3. Add the vinegar and sugar and cook for a further 3–5 minutes, or until the chutney has caramelised slightly. Serve immediately.

WHAT IS U3A? - Open Afternoon Wednesday 2nd October, **Angel Centre 2pm**

Have you recently retired, or are just looking for ways to pass the time, or find new friends? If so, U3A may be the answer. Although U3A stands for 'University of the Third Age' and was originally set up in France in the 1970s to find jobs for retired teaching staff, In England it has been reinvigorated as a voluntary body organising social and educational activities for those with time to spare. So why not come along and find out what we do? Every year we hold an Open Afternoon, and this year it will be on Wednesday 2nd October in Tonbridge's Angel Centre, this is open to everyone and starts at 2pm.

In the UK U3A has over 350,000 members across the country, organised into over 1,000 units. Tim Walford was Hildenborough Cricket Club's latest centurion but still finished up on the losing side in a near 500-run fest at Stonewall Park. Walford walked out with his side 38-3, hitting 107 off only 65 balls, including 21 fours and two sixes before retiring in a total of 225-4. However consistent batting by the hosts saw them home totalling 227-3 to win with more than five overs to spare.



Billy Francis claimed the honours with bat and ball in a 21 run home win over Kent Ramblas. He struck an unbeaten 80 with 11 fours and a six, took 3-7 in two overs with the ball, and topped things off with a run-out. Mark Davies (39), and Russell Skinner (28 not out) offering good support in Hildenborough's total of 191-3 in 35 overs. Ramblas got to 63-1, before Francis struck, the visitors reduced to 91-8, before late hitting by the No 8 batter with 49 carried them to 170-9. Tom Collier took 3-23.

A hundred by the visiting opener dominated Petts Wood's innings as they won by 12 runs. He made 100 not out in a total of 171-6. Greg Smith (54), Mark Davies (39) and Barry Webb (23) were Hildenborough's main contributors in a total of 159-5.

We then had a talk by Paul Beard -"Barnardo's, a Personal Story." He gave us a really interesting talk about the 150-year history of Barnardo's and the role they have site in Hildenborough. played in the lives of the thousands of children and young people they have helped. Thomas Barnardo was born in 1845 and after joining The Plymouth Brethren, went to London (on his way to China) for the start of his missionary work. He was shocked by the poverty and destitute children and decided he wanted to help. In 1870 he opened his first boys' orphanage, and from there several other school and homes, and this legacy has continued to the present day.

Paul has worked for Barnardo's and is a speaker and charity ambassador for them, he has also been a foster carer and told us the moving story of one of the boys that he and

his wife fostered for several years. As with many children in the care system he had a difficult start to life and was troubled as a teenager, however, he was able to find more happiness as a young adult, meeting a girl, moving in with her and starting a family. Paul and his wife fostered several children, and he continues to be an advocate for fostering and Barnardo's and the amazing work they do.

We rounded off our evening with a cup of tea and Jan read an extract from a book regarding some interesting facts about the old Fidelity

Scam Warnings

Sadly, there are scammers out there looking to prey on unsuspecting individuals. Here are some warnings to consider.

A resident got in touch recently to warn of a scamming attempt where they were called by a 'local' number claiming to be calling from BT. You should always be careful as numbers can be 'spoofed' meaning a local number could be anywhere in the world.

Parking has been a hot topic in the area recently and we have warnings of two scams. Lots of car parks now have QR codes (like square bar codes) that take you to the

operator's website. Scammers can stick a fake QR code over the top and take you to a website that may try to steal your card details.

Another one is fake text messages with a link that again takes you to a dodgy website that

may look legitimate. Kent Police's advice is to remember ABC (see the picture on the right).

Be sceptical and don't let yourself be rushed into anything.

Pets as Prizes.

I received some similar emails from residents, concerned about animals, particularly goldfish being given away as prizes from users with stalls etc, whilst on Council land.

Correspondents asked for a motion, put forward by the RSPCA, to be put to the Council asking for a ban on such practices. I am able to state that a motion is not necessary. Users of Council property/land sign up to a stringent set of conditions, which include No pets as prizes. The release of Helium filled balloons is also not permitted. A TMBC employee is on duty at such events to monitor proceedings.

Weedkillers.

I have also received an email from a resident concerned about the use of urban pesticides. These can include, and to be accurate Glyphosate (IUPAC name: N-(phosphonomethyl)glycine) is a broadspectrum systemic herbicide and crop desiccant. and MCPA ((2-methyl-4-chlorophenoxyacetic acid) and is a widely used phenoxy herbicide introduced in 1945).

TMBC's contractors for grounds maintenance do use both chemicals especially with difficult weeds and areas, but their use is reducing. Tonbridge Sportsground Management Plan has numerous projects and Project 47 is to investigate alternatives for weed control, this can be steam machine and or various acids. The main driver for the ban comes from Pesticide Action Network UK and Pesticide Collaboration. You will have seen in the news Lambeth Council stopped controlling weeds and things got out of control. One idea put forward for weed control is residents weeding their area by hand.

Tonbridge Community Forum (TCF).

The Tonbridge part of Hildenborough ward benefits from Tonbridge Groups coming

together at the TCF, a couple of times a year. Unfortunately, despite a great number of groups in Tonbridge, attendance at the TCF has been in decline, and that can be for many reasons. The Overview and Scrutiny Committee are reviewing the TCF with a check on Tonbridge Groups to secure their wishes and what they now require from the TCF.

My Grandad, who turns 88 on the 25th of this month, keeps his garden immaculately. He still proudly presides over a wonderful display at this time of year, and it would be a lie if I said I'd never 'borrowed' anything for my designs. Here are some of our Autumn favourites for making beautiful displays.

- 1. Dahlias (right) a wonderful 'cut and come again' staple for any garden these will continue to bloom until the first frosts so continue to keep snipping them. Dramatic enough to hold their own in a stem vase or as part of a larger tonal display, they hold a well-deserved place as one of our all-time favourites.
- 2. Nerines a last splash of ornamental colour, often in bright pinks. I discovered these after Grandad gifted me some bulbs one year I wasn't as successful at growing them as he is, but they

cut so well and last in the vase, bringing a pop of colour indoors.

- 3. Sedum a great plant to use throughout its lifecycle, but now it is in full flower often with a rusty red hue. This will also last forever in the vase and its 'tree like' heads can be used to provide structure and support for other more delicate stems.
- 4. Hydrangea the way a hydrangea flower changes colour throughout the season fascinates me. By now, they are often deepening and mottled in colour. Grandad's hydrangea always has both blue and pink flowers on the same plant and they fade out to gorgeous crimsons and greens. They will dry beautifully and create a lasting display inside.
- 5. Camelia Grandad of course has great success with his camelias, they are always absolutely covered in flowers later in winter. The glossy, dark green leaves however make a lovely foliage to incorporate now into designs and are a wonderful combination with the rich colours of the autumn flowers.

As always, have a go. Snip what's available to you and have a go at arranging it indoors. Working with flowers is proven to make us feel better, reducing stress - I'm sure this must be one of Grandad's best kept secrets and the reason he's still able to enjoy being outside every day,

working with the earth.



Finally, a quick reminder to get ahead for next season October is still a great time to get your spring bulbs in the ground if you haven't already.
I'll be starting to look ahead to Christmas soon and the onset

of wreath making draws near!

Setting dogs up for success

Living with dogs can be fun and fulfilling, but it can also be frustrating and annoying. When things go wrong, we often wonder how to 'stop' a particular behaviour. The problem with focusing on stopping a behaviour, is that it leads us to think about punishment. In scientific terms, punishment is something that stops or reduces a behaviour. But for it to have this effect, punishment is usually something aversive (i.e. an unpleasant sensation). There's a whole scale from mildly aversive (looking cross) to highly aversive (shock collars and the like). But arguments about what punishment to apply and when and how rather miss the point. Rather than focusing on stopping a dog doing something, and punishing them for it, we can instead focus on creating and strengthening wanted behaviours by using rewards. Rewards (positive reinforcement) can be anything a dog likes and would happily work for, and includes food, toys, play, running, sniffing, searching, retrieving, tugging, praise and attention. The skill is in controlling their access to things they want to get to

(squirrels, escape, eating poo etc) while rewarding them for doing what we want (walking nicely on a lead without pulling, coming back when called, leaving poo alone etc). Although when you first set out to train your dog you might need to use lures and lots of rewards, once they've learnt verbal or visual cues the lures can be dispensed with; and once they've realised that training is fun, you'll find yourself providing different rewards. So, rather than seemingly handfuls of food, suddenly your praise means more, or the training itself becomes motivating to your dog and you can expect a lot more for a couple of food treats, or the opportunity to chase after a ball. When dogs are rewarded for doing wanted behaviours, the unwanted behaviours begin to disappear because they've been replaced or are no longer useful to them. The other added benefit of reward-based training of course, is that it makes for a much more pleasant experience for your dog! For contact details, see page 25.

These forms of exercise will not only help boost your mental health but can prevent osteoporosis and increase bone density amongst many other benefits during Menopause. Eating healthily is also key. Limiting certain foods and drinks may reduce some symptoms.

In the solar system, as in the wider universe, not much moves in a perfect circle. The orbits of the Moon around the Earth and the planets and other objects around the Sun are all ellipses. In some cases, these are almost circular but in others they are extremely elliptical. Comets are a prime example of bodies that move in orbits far removed from circles. Closer to home, the Moon moves around us on an elliptical path whilst at the same time we move elliptically around the Sun. The result of this is that the distances between the three bodies is constantly changing. We can see this for ourselves in the way the size of the Moon varies which occasionally provides us with a "supermoon". This is something that is seriously over hyped by the media and possibly indicates a "not much news day". Any casual observer who glances at the full Moon on such an occasion won't immediately be struck by its suddenly engrossed proportions.

Because the Moon has to be opposite the Sun to appear full, it follows that at such a time, the Moon is rising as the Sun is setting so the rising full Moon is always seen at a comparatively sensible hour. It is a well-known phenomenon that a full Moon always looks larger when it is seen rising against other foreground objects such as trees and buildings even when it isn't a supermoon. If you watch the Moon rising and then look again several hours later you will see that, miraculously, it has reverted to its regular size. It's entirely likely that if the full Moon were to rise at 3am then the term supermoon would never have come into existence.

Of course, the supermoon does appear larger but not by very much. If we go back to thinking about elliptical orbits, then when the Moon is at perigee

(closest to Earth) it is around 7% larger than average and when it is at apogee (furthest from Earth) it is 7% smaller than average. It is also brighter when it appears larger but only because there is (apparently) more surface area to reflect the sunlight onto the Earth.

Another example of an elliptical orbit can be seen on 2nd October when the southern tip of South America experiences an eclipse of the Sun. In most total solar eclipses, the Sun's light is blotted out completely which allows us to observe the corona, the Sun's outer atmosphere which is normally invisible to us. However, on the 2nd of this month, the Moon will be slightly more distant from the Earth with the result that it appears smaller and in fact not large enough to obscure all of the Sun. The result is what astronomers call an "annular" eclipse because a ring (annulus) of sunlight remains visible even when the Moon is centrally located in front of the Sun. If you would like to witness the event there are always live feeds on the internet if you do a search. The eclipse begins at 5:50pm and finishes at 9:39pm BST.

For planetary observers, the evening sky is an improving picture with Mars rising at 11pm, Jupiter at 9.30pm and Saturn at 6pm on the 1st October. If you look at the map for September, the planets are in virtually the same positions although Mars is slightly further east (left). Just be aware that although the relationship of the planets to the stars is very similar the sky has rotated a little towards the west.

Venus is still very low down in the SW (just 8° high) at sunset around the middle of October. Please wait until the Sun has set before searching for it with any optical aid to avoid any damage to your eyes.

On Wednesday 11th September, the Parish Council met following the summer break during which time sadly, the council's Vice-Chair, Cllr Karen Dobson, resigned from the council for personal reasons. This means there is a vacancy for a new parish councillor which is the perfect role for anyone wishing to get more involved in serving their local community. Parish councillors are required to attend one council meeting a month, on a Wednesday evening, and be willing to join at least one of the committees - Planning, Finance and/or Open Spaces. The council currently has members from a diverse range of backgrounds leading to interesting discussions from a range of perspectives about issues concerning the residents of Hildenborough. Please contact me for more information if you think this is a role you would like to consider.

Highways

At the September Parish Council meeting the councillors agreed unanimously to accept Kent County Council's offer to upgrade the existing village name plate on the B245 to a "gateway" with the words "Please Drive Carefully" to remind motorists of the 30mph speed limit as they come into Hildenborough from the London Road end of the B245. With regard to the potential installation of double yellow lines opposite the Harvest Garage to try and deter inconsiderate parking, the first stage of the process will be for the Parish Council to carry out a "Preconsultation Engagement" exercise to provide evidence to Tonbridge and Malling District Council of local support for the

project. Judging by the number of complaints we receive regarding the risks being posed to pedestrians by motorists obstructing the pavement, we trust there will be plenty of support for anything that will improve safety for residents.

Recreation Ground

This summer our contractor spent a couple of days clearing out the ditches around part of the perimeter of the Recreation Ground, ready for the rainy season. We were very pleased that the work was completed quickly with a thorough clean up and removal of the debris afterwards, resulting in minimum disruption to the users of the Rec'.

Our Maintenance Contractor, Andy, has repaired the broken fence at the playground recently and treated it with preservative and one of the next jobs on the list will be to repair patches of the surface of the playground that are showing signs of wear and tear. Members of the Parish Council and an ex-councillor undertook a playground safety training course during the summer to enable them to carry out the weekly safety checks in the event that Andy is unable to do so.

West Wood

Work on completing the installation of the new picnic table in memory of Cllr Mike Dobson was completed this summer and all that is left to do now is to fill the planter with a selection of hardy plants. There is no water supply close by for watering the plants which will limit the choice but there are

drought-tolerant plants, such as grasses, that it has been suggested would be suitable.

Nature has been working its magic around the renovated pond, with native plants repopulating the areas that were covered in silt that was removed from the pond when the work was carried out. However, thorny brambles are winning the race to re-establish themselves so the Hildenborough Conservation Group are being asked to recommend how best to manage the process so that more attractive, native wild plants can hold sway over the brambles.

Village Green

We would like to say a big "thank you" to the residents who have been helping to look after the trees and planters on the Village Green all through the summer. Their regular watering of the flowers in the planters has helped to ensure a colourful display for residents and users of this local public space to enjoy.

Police

This summer we said goodbye to Hildenborough's Beat Officer, PC Ollie Evans, who has moved on to pastures new and from 9th September PC Tom Mead took over the role. Before he left, Ollie asked me to share the following message with readers of Keys magazine: "I have enjoyed my 15 months working in Hildenborough and would like to thank the residents for being so forthcoming with me. The village is a very safe and respectful place to live and work in and it has been a pleasure to see the community spirit thrive. Remember to remain vigilant and report anything suspicious to the police or Parish Council as, believe it or not, there is lots going on behind the scenes working towards keeping you safe! All the best, Ollie."


I am sure PC Tom Mead will enjoy meeting Hildenborough's residents as he familiarises himself with his new area.

Companies House confirmed that their online services will move to the GOV.UK One Login beginning from autumn 2024.

The GOV.UK One Login is becoming an increasingly important way of accessing government digital services. It means that you only need one account, one username, and one password to access a range of government services.

The Login is already used for a

number of government services, including those related to being an apprenticeship provider and finding and applying for grants.

Ultimately, the GOV.UK One Login will be used to access all GOV.UK services, which eventually would include tax services. Companies House services moving across will be a major step towards this goal.

The Find and update company information service will be the first to move across, with the Webfiling service being moved at a later date

As part of the changes being made by the Economic Crime and Corporate Transparency Act, any person who sets up, runs, or controls a company in the UK will need to verify their identity.

The GOVUK Login will be used when Companies House implement this requirement so that users can verify their identity directly.
