

From the Church

Gaffer tape was originally developed during World War II for sealing ammunition cases. It was also used to repair

military equipment, including jeeps, firearms and aircraft. Gaffer tape is still the preferred go to for fixing many jobs today. In Finland, gaffer tape is actually called 'Jesus Tape', because it repairs everything!

We celebrate and remember Christmas in the Church because Christmas reminds us that Jesus did not come into a dirty stable and hurting world to rub shoulders with the rich and famous of His time. Jesus had a mandate to save the lost, to help the broken, and fix the lives of those who had come to the end of fixing themselves. In the Nativity, God visually demonstrates that restoration and repair has literally come into the centre of our real and troubled lives. Jesus came to make a difference that was literally out of this world. God's power given through Jesus, has the ability to restore and save those who ask Jesus for His help. God was sending His son to restore humankind's relationship with their creator. Shepherds, the outsiders of firstcentury society, the ultra-poor, would be visited by angels, and be the first to meet the Saviour of the world. That is not to say that Jesus' message was just for the poor, but it was showing that God's priorities weren't the priorities of society at large. He had come to show the impossible strength of the gospel to those who had no strength of their own.

Gaffer tape has three core qualities: it repairs everything; it is impossibly strong; and when it touches you, you can't get it off.

When you meet Jesus, He has the power to repair lives, He is impossibly strong and once you have met Him you understand that nothing else is worth having unless Jesus is at the centre of your life.

The Gaffer Tape Gospel has restoration at its very heart; it speaks directly into our prejudices, our divisions. It is the gospel for immigration, integration and collaboration. It takes away our petty differences and offers us true unity in head and heart, unity under the headship and lordship of this tiny baby. As St Paul says, 'He is before all things, and in him all things hold together' (Colossians 1:17).

Before Jesus, my life was broken and needed to be stuck together. My heart needed the power of restoration that only Jesus could restore and once I met Him, my whole life changed for the better. Once met, He is impossible to forget or live without, such is the power of the baby that was born that first Christmas day. The tape the world offers is not sticky enough or strong enough to do the trick. The Gospel means good news and this gospel, as the angel said, is 'good news that will cause great joy for all the people' (Luke 2:10).

For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counsellor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. Isaiah 9:6





Helping People in West Kent: The Work of DAVSS

Domestic abuse affects many people across the country. DAVSS (Domestic Abuse Volunteer Support Services) is a charity that helps anyone aged 16 and over who is experiencing domestic abuse in the West Kent area, offering free support and working with people for as long as needed, helping them to feel safe and in control of their lives.

DAVSS offers help to people facing all kinds of abuse and with a caring and flexible approach, DAVSS gives each person the right support for their situation, helping them make safer choices and avoid more dangerous situations. People can contact DAVSS directly, but the charity also works with the Police, Social Services, doctors, and other groups. Serving the West Kent areas of Sevenoaks, Tunbridge Wells, and Tonbridge & Malling, DAVSS offers free support across these communities.

What DAVSS Offers

DAVSS runs a helpline with trained volunteers who provide support over the phone. Volunteers are trained to give both practical advice and emotional support. They guide people through difficult situations, such as going to court, getting protection orders, and making sure they are as safe as possible. Thanks to a partner law firm, DAVSS clients also have access to free legal advice when they need it.

For people who are trying to rebuild their lives after abuse, DAVSS provides tool kits that teach them about healthy relationships. They also work with other local organisations, such as West Kent Mind, to help clients with mental health and other needs.

Supporting Families and the Community

DAVSS knows that domestic abuse affects entire families. That's why they run special programmes for survivors and their children (ages 8-18). These programs cover important skills like handling emotions, coping strategies, and self-esteem. Children and adults build resilience by learning these skills in group settings, helping them make positive changes and feel more supported. DAVSS also runs peer support groups where survivors can meet, share stories, and feel connected with others who have had similar experiences. These groups build confidence and offer safe spaces to talk, learn new skills, and find hope for the future.

How You Can Help DAVSS

Although DAVSS gets some funding from local councils, they still depend on donations and grants. Community support is crucial to keeping their services going. Volunteers are especially important, helping as caseworkers, helpline advisors, and support group leaders. Who Let The Dads Out?

Hi, my name is Steve Wood and I have been part of the congregation at St John's for a year now. I am married and have 3 grown up boys living at home.

I help lead the Who Let the Dads Out group and have been helping for nearly a year now.

We meet monthly on the First Saturday from 9:30 until 11am in the church centre. Who let

the dads out aims to provide a safe place for fathers, father figures and their children, to come and meet others, to provide a safe environment to spend time together and for them to have fun, form friendships and find support.

We are part of a national network of groups, although each local group is slightly different.

I and the rest of the team arrive about 9am. Our first job is to get the Inflatables out of storage and then we set out the toys, mats and other items. While we do that the kitchen team prepare the bacon sandwiches, snacks and drinks.

By 9:30 the dads start to arrive, and their children can't wait to do all that is available! I might end up serving the Coffee or Tea taking around the Bacon Sandwiches, sorting out Gluten free

alternatives, or just chatting to the dads.

We might have other activities depending on the time of year but all to enable that interaction.

Most of the time is spent on the Saturday morning setting up and putting away, and we tend to spend 3 hours in total a month.

I used to be involved in a different group, and it has been good to bring those skills over. One of the key skills in running the group is meeting people, talking

to new dads. The other one is making sure we have enough helpers and a volunteer cook.

A personal highlight was when we introduced the inflatable slide. We had some very surprised faces from children and dads alike!







FARMERS MARKET RECIPE Chocolate Truffles

Ingredients to make about 18 truffles

100g Cadburys Bournville chocolate 25g slightly salted butter 3 tbs double cream 25g ground almonds 50g icing sugar 75g sweet biscuits, crushed 2 tbs rum (optional)

Method

Melt 75g of the chocolate and grate the remainder. Stir all the other ingredients into the melted chocolate, mixing well.

Leave in the fridge until firm enough to handle fairly easily.

Divide mixture evenly and roll into about 18 balls, tossing them in the grated chocolate. To make them look Christmassy coat with sprinkles and/or add a small edible Christmassy decoration.

The Oast Theatre celebrates 50 Years!

This year the Oast Theatre, London Road, Tonbridge, is celebrating a milestone: fifty years as a vibrant home of theatre, but it has an even longer history. Tonbridge Amateur Dramatic Society, TADS, began productions one hundred and two years ago, in 1922, later merging with Tonbridge Little Theatre, TLT, to become Tonbridge Theatre and Arts Club, TTAC, in 1946.

However, space was limited in the drama society's original home, the old stables behind the Mitre public house in Hadlow Road, so a new premises had to be found. The redundant Oast House on London Road was deemed a suitable premises, albeit a huge conversion project. Originally a working farm building in the 1800s, where hops were dried and packaged for the brewery, it was converted after much fundraising into a theatre, with its first performance in 1974.

Since then the Oast has grown into a highly regarded and well established centre of drama and art. There are ten productions on the main stage a season, three of which are performed by the teenagers of the thriving youth group, plus one by the 8-13 year olds, 'The Hoppers'. The theatre studio upstairs also presents one act plays and we often host visiting performers such as, recently, The Brothers Broke, a tribute to John Lennon and Bob Dylan, and Alan Bennett's An Englishman Abroad, being performed by Paul Doust as Guy Burgess, on 22nd-24th November.

The Oast Theatre is a busy place! It is run by a huge team of dedicated, kind, talented volunteers whose help in all areas backstage and frontstage is invaluable. Around 100 people are involved in every production, there's set building and painting, front of

house meet and greet, selling tickets and refreshments, costumes, lighting, sound, poster and programme design, stage management, props, publicity, marketing, cleaning, gardening, general maintenance, and of course, not forgetting the actors and directors! There's always lots going on with an enormous amount of team spirit, friendship and community running throughout.

Come along and join us if you like the sound of this. The enthusiasm of our volunteers

keeps the theatre vibrant, but we always need more help!

If you do fancy getting involved, being part of the crew, making new friends, channelling your inner creative spirit, come and join us for a coffee on a Wednesday morning (0900-1200) and meet some of the team who make The Oast such a fun and friendly place. Membership is £30 a year, enabling you to enjoy discounts on tickets whilst also helping to support your local theatre. The Oast

Theatre isn't just a theatre, it's a club and we need any help you can offer to keep it going, to keep it alive, to keep it a place for the community.

T.M.B.C. News

Council Offices.

When I was first fortunate enough to be elected to the Council, the Council offices in the then West Malling consisted of the Gibson Building, the former officer's mess of West Malling Airfield and some former airfield buildings, affectionately known as the H buildings. There were also staff at Tonbridge Castle offices. Then in 1998 the Council put an application in to build the new offices linked to the Gibson building with a corridor. In the picture, an aerial Google shot, the Gibson Building is on the left (dark roofs) and the newer offices the right, (silver roof) with a narrow corridor linking them.



The Gibson building is Grade 2 listed, built in 1939 and West Malling airfield was opened in June 1940, although a series of raids in August 1940 rendered the airfield unserviceable for much of the Battle of Britain. It reopened in October of that year, becoming a night fighter station with Bristol Beaufighters in 1941, and later used by Mosquitos and Typhoons in offensive operations in northern Europe; it became a key station during 'Operation Diver' in 1944, the name given to the defence of the east and south-eastern coasts against the V1 bomb. The Officer's mess included accommodation and forms part of an exceptionally well-

preserved group of buildings on the domestic site which are strongly representative of the neo-Georgian and Art Deco type designs characteristic of the 1930s expansion period and seen elsewhere. The present Council chamber is within the Gibson building. The Civic entrance to the Gibson building is shown in picture 2, the Council Chamber, are the 5 windows to the right.



So, what is going to happen; the Council has now applied for planning and listed permission (it has to apply to itself) to completely separate the buildings by removing the corridor link, reinstating what is necessary to the Gibson building and adding some extras to the newer buildings, solar panels, EV charging, bike stands, new doors, ramps and facilities on the ground floor for a new Council Chamber. A decision on the Gibson building and its future is yet to be taken. The main entrance to the newer offices is shown below and is now considered to be part of Kings Hill.

Both applications planning and listed were approved by full Council..

Evening WI: Our November meeting started by welcoming our members and one visitor who had joined us for the evening. We went through some general WI business and updates of forthcoming events and activities. Following on from our discussion last month everyone had bought along some items for the foodbank, and we will do this each month now.

INSPIRING WOMEN

Our speaker for the evening was Janie Ramsay who is a member of The West Kent Green Team, (part of the WI) who are climate change ambassadors. Throughout the UK there are over 220 thousand WI members-we can make a difference.

Janie talked about the areas where small changes can make a difference. The campaign to use less water: she talked about ways we can save water and use less. Save water and then reuse it, for example to water the garden. Consider our energy use, switching things off rather than leaving them on standby, using LED lightbulbs, washing clothes at a lower temperature. Reduce food waste, buy locally sourced food and support farmers' markets. Reduce, reuse, recycle. Use a refill shop. There is one in Tonbridge.

She talked to us about the textile industry and their huge carbon footprint. Consider the clothes you buy and the clothes in your wardrobe, buy from charity shops. She explained that there are 1.75 million tonnes of clothing wasted in the UK every year. She finished her talk by saying we can all make small changes, we don't need to do everything all at once but everything we do helps.

Our next meeting is *Tuesday 10th December*, when Penny Harris will be our speaker for the evening, delivering her talk "Potholes, Pigs and Paradise".

The evening WI meets once a month and gives members the opportunity to meet new people, learn new skills, and have fun. We always welcome new members, so please feel free to just drop in and say hello, even just for one evening to see what we are all about.

Please note our meeting time, we meet in the family room at the Church Centre at 7.15pm for a 7.30pm start.

St. John's Church, Hildenborough and Hildenborough History Society

In September 2021 Hildenborough History Society published its book "Hildenborough Our Village" and sold out all 729 copies within a matter of weeks. However, during the 180th anniversary celebrations of the founding of St John's, Hildenborough, there were so many requests for copies of the book that the church asked HHS to instigate a reprint, which it would underwrite and retain any profit accruing.

HHS were happy to agree to this and following an update of the text which has only corrected errors in fact and grammar but without allowing additions except where this did not affect the page numbering.

The Night Sky in Hildenborough – December 2024

In astronomy, as in life sometimes, it's all or nothing. During December the bright planets are dominating the evening sky after what seems an inordinately long wait. The predawn planetary observer will now have to be satisfied with Mars and Jupiter making their way towards the west.

Early in the month, when the Sun is 6° below the horizon at around 4:30pm, the brilliant Venus can be seen a little over 12° above the SSW horizon. As the sky darkens Venus sets in the south west, but soon after it does so, by way of compensation, Mars rises in the ENE. The result is that by 9:30pm Mars, Jupiter and Saturn are all on view and reasonably well positioned.

Towards the end of the month, look at 7:30pm to see them in similar locations with the bonus that Venus has moved to join the group and is low down in the WSW. Its position will continue to improve for the rest of 2024 and into 2025.

You can use the map printed in the November issue to locate the planets which will be accurate at 8pm in the middle of December apart from the position of the Moon.

Although Venus is by far the most brilliant object in the early evening sky, and still brightening, once it has set ,Jupiter, although not quite as striking, is very obvious towards the east. On the 3rd of this month, it reaches "opposition" which is when it is closest to Earth and therefore at its largest and brightest.

If you get the chance to look at it through a telescope you will see the bands of cloud that envelope the gas giant, and if you're lucky the Great Red Spot may be visible. This is an anti-cyclonic storm in Jupiter's atmosphere where winds can blow at up to 400mph. It has been present since at least 1830 and may possibly date back to as early as 1665. You may also note when viewing that Jupiter is not actually round, rather it is "oblate" which means it is flattened at the poles. This is caused by centrifugal force due to the massive body rotating in just ten hours. If you have binoculars, you will be able to watch the daily dance of the four Galilean moons as they orbit the planet, although you are unlikely to see them if your binoculars are hand-held. They really need to be tripod mounted or, at the very least, rested against a fence post or wall.

The winter solstice, for us in the northern hemisphere, occurs on 21st December at 9:21am. This is when the Sun is as far south in the sky as it can get, meaning that we only have 7 hours 52 minutes and 5 seconds of daylight that day. This contrasts with the summer solstice on 20th June when we had 16 hours 35 minutes and 43 seconds of daylight.

2025 should be an interesting year astronomically speaking with strong meteor showers in January and December that will be unaffected by moonlight. Also, we have a partial eclipse of the Moon and a partial eclipse of the Sun, both of which are in March as well as a total eclipse of the Moon in September. So, plenty to look forward to.

At the November Finance Committee Meeting, councillors discussed the Parish Council's budget for next year and agreed to recommend that the members approve a small increase of 2% in the precept for the next financial year due to inflation and to cover the cost of projects including the installation of a footpath around the Recreation Ground. The council is also in the process of building up a reserve fund to build a new pavilion in the Rec which will be an enormous asset to the community. Other projects earmarked for next year include a sustainable landscaping project in the Recreation Ground; installation of a new fence around the playground in the Rec and the addition of one or two items of accessible playground equipment to the existing equipment in both the Village's playgrounds.

At the November Parish Council meeting, Kent County Councillor, Cllr. Harry Rayner asked the Parish Council to help make local residents aware of the Winter Fuel Payment, where residents born before 23rd September 1958 could get either £200 or £300 to help pay heating bills. Highways

An expert in traffic management attended the Planning Committee Meeting held on 11th November to advise the Committee on how best to prepare for any future housing


developments comprising 100 or more properties with regard to local highways infrastructure. He explained that independent traffic surveys have to be carried out as part of the pre-application process which are considered by Kent County Council, the highways authority. KCC's recommendations with regard to the impact of a development on local traffic flow are then taken into consideration by the planning authority, Tonbridge & Malling Borough Council. There is no requirement for the Parish Council to undertake its own surveys but the councillors will be following the progress of any development proposals and ensuring they meet all planning criteria.

At the November Parish Council meeting the councillors approved the purchase of a speed warning sign for installation on Riding Lane, to remind motorists emerging from the national speed limit that they are entering a built up area and need to slow down. It is hoped this will make it safer for motorists pulling out of the Recreation Ground car park and for all pedestrian traffic in this busy hub of the village. The councillors also approved the pre-consultation engagement survey with regard to the installation of double yellow lines opposite the Harvest Garage on London Road. The survey will be distributed to residents living close to where the proposed double yellow lines will be located and will also be promoted on the Hildenborough Parish Council Facebook page and website. Alternatively, please e-mail

clerk@hildenboroughparishcouncil.gov.uk if you wish to complete the survey.

Following a request to Tonbridge & Malling Borough Council to install a dog waste bin opposite the BP Garage on the other side of Tonbridge Road, I can report that the request was refused on the following grounds: there is already a dog bin located nearby that adequately serves the needs of local dog owners; the proposed location for a new bin is

too close to residential homes, which may lead to concerns regarding odour and cleanliness; the installation and ongoing maintenance of an additional bin would incur costs that are not currently justified given the existing resources; based on the TMBC's assessments, the volume of dog waste generated in this area does not warrant the addition of another bin.




