




Are you over State Pension age, or know someone who is?

Meet the volunteer – Starlight **Puppets**

Hi I'm Dave Hopkins and I have been part of the congregation at St John's for a year now, but have lived in Hadlow for over 20 years.

I help lead Starlight Puppet team.


The team has been running for 7 years and moved to St John's in 2023. Overall, I have been working with puppets for 24 years as part of another adult only team.

Starlight Puppet Team aims to bring the bible stories to life using Muppet Style puppets, we also have a wide range of popular songs that have different wording that we might use to help tell the story. The team consists of both adults and young people and anyone over the age of 10 (year 6 at school) are welcome to come and try out for the team. Age is no limit as the oldest puppeteer I know is in her 80s and still able to perform and travels around the schools in her area.

Starlight Puppets have fortnightly practice sessions on a Sunday afternoon from 3:30 until 5pm, meeting before Hive Youth Group, which the kids are encouraged to attend.

In each session we do some basic training, practise a sketch, a song or discuss an upcoming performance, either in St John's or at another location or Church.

Other things we might do include making props and recording sketches. We might also

When we

How many hours a week do you spend doing it? Normally it is 2 hours every fortnight, but if we lead a service or go to a different location this can be a little more, as the leaders tend to go and setup before the younger members arrive, but we all help to pack away.

What skills have you picked up in this role? Being able to be flexible enough in what we do to change what we have planned due to a change in circumstances on the day. We had a Christmas service where we had a narrator out front and accidentally they turned over 2 pages and we had to quickly get the whole nativity story back to the right spot, which meant giving instructions via the puppet to the other team members without anyone realising.

Do you receive training? Most years we attend a Festival in Rugby dedicated to the Creative ministries called Equip Festival. There we get to see other teams perform in competitions, we can enter a competition if we wish, watch the showcase performances from experts, and then attend specific workshops led by the experts. The festival covers Puppets, Illusions, Ventriloquism and Children and Youth ministry. There is even the opportunity to join the Academy who spend a week in August working very hard to bring together an evening's performance. It's really good to go and meet friends and make new friends each year.

What is the best thing or your best memory about your role? The reaction we get after a service has ended. People are often surprised at how good it was and one of the best reactions was when we were at Scott's Project and the way the residents and Day Visitors reacted. We were also asked to lead a School Assembly at a Secondary School where I used to work, and how after we had finished staff members said it had changed their view of Christianity and how relevant it was.

What is the worst thing or your worst memory about your role? Saying goodbye to those who have been at the group but who



have now left for university, and when something happens to delay our arrival and having to be super quick in setting up.

FARMERS MARKET RECIPE

Quick and Easy Vegetable Curry

A very quick and easy curry to serve up with rice and a salad.

Ingredients – makes 5 servings

- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 1 onion, chopped
- 2 cloves crushed garlic
- 2 ¹/₂ tablespoons curry powder
- 2 tablespoons tomato paste
- 1 400g can diced tomatoes
- 1 cube vegetable bouillon
- 285g package frozen mixed vegetables
- 350ml cups water
- salt and pepper to taste
- 2 tablespoons chopped fresh coriander

Directions

1. In a large saucepan over mediumhigh, heat oil and sauté onion and garlic until golden. Stir in curry powder and tomato paste, cook 2 to 3 minutes.

2. Stir in tomatoes, vegetable bouillon cube, mixed vegetables, water, salt and pepper to taste. Cook approximately 30 minutes until vegetables are well done (not crunchy). Sprinkle with fresh coriander prior to serving.



St. John's Church, Hildenborough and Hildenborough History Society

In September 2021 Hildenborough History Society published its book "**Hildenborough** *Our Village*" and sold out all 729 copies within a matter of weeks. May I wish all Hildenborough residents and businesses a Very Happy New Year.

Leigh Barrier Improvements.

The Environment Agency state, they have made great progress over recent months. Last September they successfully installed the first of the three new gates (below) on the control structure. The old Barrier gates are now 42 vears old. In the field at Hawden Farm, sheet piling has been in progress and work on the Penstock chamber starts soon. A comment about the programme being tight has been made by the EA but completion is anticipated to be by the end of 2025.

Waste Contract.

The Borough Council's waste service is one of the biggest contracts at circa £1.78M for the 2024/25 period. It must be expected that





this cost will rise for 2025/26.

K.C.C.

The whole of Knowsley Way is programmed for treatment works during 2025/26. The actual type of surface treatment will be confirmed after a site assessment.

Hildenborough Parking.

The Hildenborough Parking action plan is due next year (it's been a long time coming). Informal consultation has been undertaken and now Formal consultation will take place early next year. Generally speaking residents wanted corner protection by double yellow lines; the resident parking areas were not so popular as were double yellow lines along stretches of various roads.

TMBC Procurement.

Amazingly after all these years, the Auditors, Grant Thornton highlighted the fact that TMBC did not have a procurement strategy i.e. where do we order the next lorry load of paperclips from. Considering the Council is still here since 1974, those paperclips were

obviously sourced from somewhere. Anyway, TMBC is joining the Mid Kent Procurement Partnership initially for 2 years; work has started on a number of contracts including waste and recycling, litter enforcement and construction.

Stop The Knock.

The Council is to pilot a scheme of up to 500 cases whereby 'ReachOut' are commissioned to engage with residents who are struggling with debt, helping them get support to improve their financial, mental and physical wellbeing and hopefully reconnect those residents with TMBC in-house teams to resolve their debts. ReachOut are not debt collectors, they engage, offer help,

impartiality and confidentiality and take time to understand individual circumstances and challenges.

The Night Sky in Hildenborough – January 2025

The sky, as I'm sure you know, rises and sets carrying with it the stars, Sun, Moon and any number of other celestial bodies. A process that is nothing to do with the sky itself, rather it is a result of the Earth spinning on its axis giving rise to the illusion that the celestial sphere is on the move and rotating about the north and south celestial poles (NCP and SCP). These poles are simply the Earth's poles of rotation projected into space and onto the imaginary celestial sphere. You probably know that the north celestial pole is marked by the star Polaris, which is in the constellation of Ursa Minor (the little bear). However, not all of the sky moves in the way I've just suggested with a portion centred on the NCP (and SCP for those south of the equator) that in fact never sets at all. The size of this circle of sky is determined by where on the Earth we are situated, or to be more precise, how far from the pole we are.

If you were standing at the north pole, the (NCP) would be overhead and your latitude would be $+90^{\circ}$. However, our location on the Earth's surface gives us a latitude of about 52° so, for us, the north celestial pole is 52° above the horizon. To take this to its logical conclusion, if you were on the equator, latitude 0° , you would have the NCP on one horizon and the SCP on the other. This means that everything in the sky would be visible to you at some time during the year.

To go back to my point about some of the sky not setting, it follows from what I said above that anything you can see that lies between the NCP and the northern horizon will never set from our latitude. Admittedly, it will be in different positions throughout the year, note how the position of the Plough changes with the seasons, but it will never pass below the horizon. We call anything that doesn't set "circumpolar".

One advantage of this is that the Quadrantids meteor shower, that reaches peak activity on the night of the 3rd/4th January, is circumpolar which will be an advantage if the sky is clear as it can be a very active shower. A thin crescent Moon (that incidentally will be very close to Venus) will have set in the west before 8:30pm so will cause no problems. If you look generally north at an angle of around 45° you may see a meteor every 3 or 4 minutes if conditions are good.

The following night, the 4th, if you have a small telescope or binoculars take a look at the Moon at 5:15pm and you will see Saturn appearing to approach the dark edge of the Moon (it's actually the Moon that's moving) and at around 17:21 it will disappear (technically Saturn will be "occulted" by the Moon).

Should it be clear on the nights of the 15th/ 16th/17th/18th have a look towards the south west where you will see the brilliant planet Venus as it makes a close approach to Saturn. The two bodies pass less than $2\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ apart before Venus moves away towards the north. Of course they aren't close together in reality, it's just that they appear, due to a line-of-sight effect, to be near to one another.

The map is drawn for 15th January at 7:30pm and shows the positions of the four naked eye planets visible at that time. Mars is just below the two bright stars in Gemini, Castor and Pollux, whilst Jupiter is in Taurus and just north of the bright star Aldebaran which has an obvious red hue. Saturn and Venus are below the Square of Pegasus and more or less in line with the two righthand stars of the square. **Brian Mills FRAS**

Hildenborough Litter Pickers



The story of Edwina Hall.

Penny told us the story of Edwina, how she met and fell in love with a pilot who had been shot down, injured, lost a leg, and been taken prisoner in Italy. The story started when Edwina Hallett was an 18-year-old girl growing up in Tunbridge Wells. Churchill was Prime Minister, and the war had started in Europe. She decided to join up and was sent for training to Gloucestershire where she learnt to drive trucks. In 1942 she was sent to collect injured repatriated airmen, this is where she met John Brodie Thomson Hall: they fell in love and in ten weeks were married. He needed intensive treatment following his injuries but fought to get back to flying and continued to fly until the war ended. Edwina continued driving trucks throughout the war.

After the war John and Edwina decided they wanted to run a pub and finally took over The Blacksmiths Arms in Chiddingstone. It took time for them to settle to this new way of life, but eventually became part of the local community. At times the pub became really busy, such as hop picking season, when pickers would descend on them from London for several weeks at a time.

By 1950 the couple had had their first child and decided to leave the pub and buy a smallholding. This was a lovely talk about Edwina's life and her love for John. It was great to hear about the places that are so familiar to us and about a very different way of life.

A few of the ladies read some Christmas poetry and we shared some festive treats with a welcome cup of tea before wishing everyone a Merry Christmas, at the end of another successful year.

Our next meeting is *Tuesday 14th January 2025*, when we will be holding our New Year party.

Hildenborough Railway Station Art



Warnings – Things to watch out for

Here is a collection of recent warnings issued by Kent Police

Rogue Charity Collectors – There have been reports of bogus door to door charity collections for Breast Cancer in the Tonbridge and Malling area. The police have spoken to several charities who have said they don't collect door to door. Please check for identification and the name of a charity before you donate money. If you're not sure, you can always donate directly to the charity.

Car Sale Scams – The scam involves 2 or 3 people attending the sellers address and whilst one distracts the seller, another will put oil in the coolant or water in the oil of the vehicle for sale. They will then show this to the seller and state that the engine, if not blown, has blown and offer a much lower amount for the vehicle. Top tips include, stay with the buyers, be wary of any enormous discount requested and be confident to refuse the sale.

Card fraud - is when a criminal steals personal information from your credit or debit card or steals the card itself. What to look out for –

• Always look after your cards and card details. Try not to let your card out of your sight when making a transaction.

• Check receipts against statements carefully. Contact your card company immediately if you find an unfamiliar transaction.

• Store your statements, receipts and financial documents safely and destroy them, preferably using a shredder, when you dispose of them.

• Sign any new cards as soon as they arrive.

• Cut expired cards through the magnetic strip and chip when replacement cards arrive.

Scam text messages – e.g. 'winter fuel payment' – Scammers may try and text you a

link to a website to claim some form of benefit or payment. This could well be a fake website designed to steal your data.

Rogue Traders - Please be wary of cold callers offering to undertake work on your property as this work may not be necessary or may not be completed to a satisfactory standard and you may be overcharged and out of pocket. If seeking a tradesperson to undertake some work on your property, please

remember to always:

• Obtain at least three written quotes.

• Ask family and friends for recommendations. (or use the adverts in Keys Magazine! – Editor)

• Agree payment arrangements and start and finish dates in writing beforehand.

• Never pay in full until you are completely satisfied with the work.



Tales from the graveyard: The **Titanic Connection - Lucy** Snape

This August we were reminded of the tragic loss of the Titanic when remote cameras showed us pictures of the now crumbling wreck (see picture below).

In April 1912 when the Titanic struck an iceberg and sank into the Atlantic Ocean the reaction at the time was of

horror as if everyone knew someone who was on the ship. There were few villages where the ripple from the sinking did not reach. Hildenborough could also trace someone known to the inhabitants who was lost in this disaster.

Thanks to the efforts of the late Tim Asquith who researched the story of this local girl we know a little of her story.

Lucy Violet, the daughter of Edward and Elizabeth Lennard was born in a village near Farnham, Surrey and was baptised at the local church on 2nd May 1890. She was eldest of nine children. Her father Edward was a groom, and they

moved from Surrey to Kent where by 1911 the family were living in Cataract Cottage at Horns Lodge near Hildenborough. He was a "Coachman" working for the Right Honourable 16th Earl of Derby. Edward's two youngest children (Ellen and Adrian) were born in Hildenborough and christened at St John's Church.

By this time Lucy is 20 and working. She had met and married Lawrence Edward Snape, this

was at the Tonbridge Register Office. The records do not show how they met but the records do show that they had a daughter Margaret Isabel Snape born on 18th June 1910 in their home the "Flying Dutchman Inn" Hildenborough where Lawrence was the Landlord.

Lawrence took a trading trip to Singapore, but sadly died of dysentery. Lucy and daughter returned to England arriving in London 7th December 1911. Lucy needed an income and having seen the work







usually aiming to get hold of personal

information and banking details.

It is helpful to know that HMRC will

never leave voicemails threatening

legal action or arrest. Neither will

they ask for personal or financial

information over text message.

BE WARY OF SELF ASSESSMENT SCAMS

HM Revenue and Customs (HMRC) have issued a reminder to be careful about scam attempts that target people filing Self Assessment tax returns. In the last year, nearly 150,000 scam attempts were referred to HMRC, a 16.7% increase on last year. With the 31 January 2025 filing deadline approaching, fraudsters are likely to step up their activities.
