# From the Church

On the 2<sup>nd</sup> February, The Church celebrates Candlemas; a Christian festival.

Candlemas is traditionally the 40th day of (and the conclusion of) Christmas.

In the scripture of Luke 2:22-40, we read about Mary and Joseph bringing the infant Jesus to the Temple in Jerusalem, they were following a Jewish law that required every firstborn male to be consecrated to the Lord. At the Temple, they encountered Simeon, a devout man who had been promised by God that he would see the Messiah before he died. Simeon's joyous words upon seeing Jesus, are known as the Nunc Dimittis or the Song of Simeon. Its name comes from the Latin phrase "Nunc dimittis servum tuum, Domine," meaning "Now let your servant depart, Lord."

Simeon proclaimed, "Lord, now you are letting your servant depart in peace, according to your word; for my eyes have seen your salvation that you have prepared in the presence of all peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and for glory to your people Israel." (Luke 2:29-32).

This moment with Simeon, highlights the fulfilment of God's promise and the revelation of Jesus as a beacon of light, hope and salvation for all. Simeon understood that he was seeing with his own eyes the living God, in the form of a baby called Jesus. He had

waited his whole life for this moment. After witnessing Jesus being presented at the temple, "He could now truly go in peace". The Church lights candles in this period as a reminder of that moment. God came in human form to bring light and hope to the darkness of the world. We use candles as a reminder of the words Jesus used to identify Himself as the light of the world. Candlemas is also an invitation for us to embrace Jesus to be a light in our own lives. Candlemas offers us an opportunity for spiritual renewal. To refocus on the work and life of Jesus and as His followers, to be led by Jesus to serve those we meet in the world. When people encounter Jesus in their hearts and lives, they often describe a sense of incredible peace. The peace Jesus offers us is not of this world but from Him. It means no matter what we face, we have Jesus as a comfort and guide giving us an inner peace. Such is the gift of peace Jesus gives to those who know Him.

I wonder if you have peace?

Maybe you would like to experience the peace that Jesus offers. It's simple really, all you have to do is ask Him. These words might help. "Lord please send me your peace, make yourself known to me in my heart." From experience when people say that kind of prayer, they find their prayers are answered.

We would love to invite you to join us for any of our services to hear more about Jesus.



new volunteer. The hall is well used and is a key part of village activities. This takes me around about 4-5 hours per week on average.


It's taught me people skills in dealing with groups of individuals who often have different views and opinions.

### FARMERS MARKET RECIPE

### A Bee-autiful Honey Cake

### **Ingredients**

- 170g/6oz clear <u>honey</u>
- 140g/5oz **butter**
- 85g/3oz light <u>muscovado sugar</u>
- 2 eggs, beaten
- 200g/7oz self raising **flour**, sieved
- water

### For the icing

- 55g/2oz icing sugar
- 1 tbsp clear honey
- hot water

### Method

- 1. Preheat oven to 180°C/350F/Gas 3 and butter and line the bottom of a 7in/18cm cake tin.
- 2. Measure the honey, butter and sugar into a large pan. Add a tablespoon of water and heat gently until melted.
- 3. Remove from the heat and mix in the eggs and flour.
- 4. Spoon into the cake tin and bake for 40-45 minutes until the cake is springy to the touch and shrinking slightly from the sides of the tin.
- 5. Cool slightly in the tin before turning out onto a wire rack.
- 6. While the cake is still warm, make the icing by mixing the sugar and honey together with 2-3 teaspoons of hot water. Trickle over the cake in whatever design takes your fancy.

# T.M.B.C. News

### **It's Coming!**

It's probably, definitely coming, in the very near, next few years. Devolution. We are told, devolution means that decision making moves closer to the citizen and is more democratic. Devolution is not new. There have been different forms of devolution in the UK for decades and it is common in other parts of the world. The current form of devolution in the UK only goes back to the late 1990s. The 2027 Borough Council elections are unlikely to be held, with a remote possibility that if matters are not in place they are deferred by 1 or 2 years; already there is talk of this year's KCC elections in May not going ahead and the KC Councillors having their term of office

Devolution will bring together a group of Borough Councils, the very likely disbandment of KCC, along with the Police and Crime Commissioner, merging the Borough Councils brings about their disbandment as well.

But which Councils, for example, would TMBC want to merge with? Let's say, if TMBC merged with Maidstone, would Tunbridge Wells want to merge with TMBC? These new merged Councils, now Unitary Authorities would take over the functions of the local Borough Council and KCC. I wonder how highways are administered at the point where the highway leaves the Boundary of the new Authority.

Parish Councils are likely to remain unchanged, but they could get more responsibility and therefore require funding (Oh yes, it is going to cost) (and the other problem is loss of localism. "I want to report a problem in Hildenborough, Oh yes, Hildenborough, where's that then?") I can see it coming.

Currently TMBC give permission for housing developments, KCC are responsible for Highways infrastructure etc. TMBC collect household refuse, KCC must dispose of it. KCC own the highways, TMBC arrange for parking and enforcement of it. KCC are

responsible for social welfare of homeless people, but TMBC must house them, so the new authority will encompass all these activities.

Residents in the new authority, probably called West Kent would also have to elect a Mayor, who would undertake greater responsibility for area wide services; economic development, police, fire, transport etc.

The Devolution White Paper is available on the Gov.UK website for download.

### Local Plan.

Shall we, or shan't we? With the above looming, TMBC is carrying on with the Local Plan, as Government suggests. There is still much to do, but we now have a deadline to submit to the Secretary of State 12/12/2026. Please visit TMBC Website for all matters to do with the plan.

### TPO.

I wrote in December about Tree Preservation Orders. The Council would set the Order up, and that Order could include single trees, groups of trees, areas of woodland or even hedging. The Order however does <u>not</u> stop authorised work to such trees etc. Any specimen(s) covered by a TPO could still require maintenance to prevent damage from falling trunks or branches etc.

As you may have seen in the press, the recent government white paper proposes significant reforms to local government, including the potential removal of Kent County Council (KCC) in favour of creating unitary authorities with an elected mayor in North Kent, East Kent and West Kent. This move would see the current two-tier structure of local government in Kent replaced with KCC overseeing county-wide services and district councils like Tonbridge & Malling Borough Council (TMBC) managing more localised services.

If the proposal goes ahead, all local services, including education, transport, social care, and housing, would be managed by a single, unified council instead of being split between KCC and individual district councils. This could lead to a more cohesive approach to local issues, with services better coordinated and potentially more responsive to the needs of communities.

For TMBC, the shift to a unitary authority would mean the loss of its independent decision-making powers in areas such as planning and housing, as these would be centralised. While the changes promise potential cost savings and operational efficiencies, they also raise concerns about the loss of local representation and the centralisation of power in a single authority. KCC have applied to be one of the first County Councils to partake in these changes

which will mean the proposed local elections this year will be postponed.

Whilst I can see huge advantages in terms of efficiencies of scale, streamlined local governance, reduced duplication of services, and more efficient decision-making by consolidating responsibilities under one authority, I am concerned about the loss of local representation. The local Green group is worried about the potential loss of democracy, as elections are postponed with no confirmed rearrangement. Local councillors will become that bit less "local", making decisions about areas they may not know so well as your TMBC councillors do now. There are many unknowns about what could or will happen next; how the role of the Parish council will be changed or indeed whether the mayor will be supported by a cabinet or an assembly more reflective of local voters. TMBC appears to be going ahead with consultation and plans for the Tonbridge Town Centre redevelopment, yet this may not be a prudent course of action as we do not yet know how assets of the proposed new unitary authorities are to be allocated and managed. I guess, once again, it's a question of watch this space!

This tax won't just hurt those in Private Schools, it will increase class sizes and put pressure on all schools in our community.

It is estimated that over 37,000 children may now need to have a place at their local state school, putting significant pressure on our Grammar Schools and Secondary Schools in particular.

Our local schools provide wonderful assets including their facilities to the community. This is certainly the case for Tonbridge School, which employes many people in the town. Jobs are under threat. Our area will be hit hard by this change.

The education system in Kent is one that demonstrates a range of secondary schools working effectively alongside one another, catering for many different needs, and can generate positive results for everyone. In our community, all schools provide that bridge to take young people to the next stage of their lives. That is why education is one of the biggest pull factors to Kent. And that's not just good for schools, it helps support local businesses, allows local communities to develop and connect, and boosts opportunities for all.



# Problems with introduced plants and animals

Green Parakeets are now well established among our wild animal species. Research finds that Britain's booming parakeet population has grown from numerous accidental and intentional pet releases. Not everyone was annoyed by having the Parrots flying free in their gardens, but others are concerned that the native bird population will suffer from competition for the food put out in feeders for our native garden birds.

There were reports of colonies of these birds from the London parks. I first met these birds while parked in Battersea Park to eat my lunch and understood why the locals were unhappy. The colony was full of noisy squabbling birds.

The vibrantly coloured bird, which is a small to medium-sized species of parrot, has been in Britain for decades, though it was unclear how they were first introduced. To solve the mystery, scientists are using geographic profiling used to track down where they came from. They are analysing patterns of parakeet sightings over the past 50 years.

Non-native species of any plant or animal can sometimes fail to acclimatise but as with this species of bird, they have adapted to our climate and found plentiful sources of food and are thriving. The flock that visited my garden recently went straight to the bird table but soon left when they found the feeders empty.

Locally we have suffered problems from nonnative plants escaping from gardens and finding the banks of the Medway an ideal habitat. One of these is the Himalayan Balsam that clogs the river and makes access to the riverbank difficult. The flowers are attractive to bees as pollinators. This leads to a difference of opinion between Beekeepers and Fishermen. A more dangerous garden escape locally is the Giant Hogweed. Control is difficult as its sap is corrosive, and precautions need to be taken before cutting the plant down.

### Warnings – Things to watch out for

Here is a collection of recent warnings issued by Kent Police

**Gift Card Fraud -** Watch out for unsolicited callers claiming you need to purchase gift cards to pay a fine or bill.

Additionally, criminals will contact you impersonating a family member or friend with a time sensitive bill to pay and state how they desperately need your help and could you buy a gift card and send them the number.

Free Amazon Laptops - I think not – A Kent resident has reported seeing on Instagram an avert which is advertising a quantity of HP laptops that Amazon are giving away to over 50's. The Adverts states you simply need to pay £2 for delivery via a debit/credit card and that the laptop is free of charge.

The resident rang Amazon who knew nothing about this scheme and confirmed that it is a scam.

Always remember if it appears too good to be true, then it is, as in this instance the criminals are looking to steal your financial data.

**Charity fraud** - Do not let your money end up in a criminal's pocket.

The risk of fraud should not put you off giving to charities but you should be vigilant and make sure you are giving safely.

**Investment Scams** – Criminals will present professional and credible-looking online adverts, send emails, and create websites to advertise fake investment opportunities.

**Ticket Fraud** – Thinking of going to an event over the coming months?

To stay safe, buy only from trusted sources: the venue's box office, official promoters, or reputable ticket sites. Fake delivery texts and emails - This was one of the fastest growing scams of 2024.

Fake parcel delivery texts involve scammers sending fake delivery notifications for parcels, prompting the recipient to click on a link to reschedule delivery and pay a fee. The link often leads to a phishing site designed to steal personal information or install malware on the victim's device.

Remain vigilant and check delivery notifications very carefully to ensure they are genuine. Text messages may look remarkably similar to those that are genuine but may use generic greetings, such as, Dear Sir/Madam, or include spelling errors. Always question claims that you are due goods or services that you have not ordered or are unaware of, especially if you have to pay any fees upfront.

# The Night Sky in Hildenborough – February 2025

Astronomy is celebrated this month with the returning "National Astronomy Week", now in its 9th year, which runs from 1st to the 9th February. It's normal for this event to occur every five years although the last one was severely hampered by Covid restrictions. The theme this year is "Chasing the Moon" where the public are encouraged to follow the Moon across the sky noting its change of position, and shape, relevant to the positions of bright stars and planets.

It starts off quite close to Saturn and Venus on the 1st, displaying a slim waxing crescent, and then travels in an arc across the sky growing in phase as it does so. By the 5th it is north of the comparatively faint Uranus having grown in phase to just past first quarter. On the 6th it lies close to, and north of, Jupiter when you will see that the Moon is now obviously "gibbous" in shape. Gibbous refers to when the illuminated portion of the Moon is between first quarter and full. On the nights of the 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> it continues to move towards the red planet, Mars, arriving there on the 9th. On that evening the Moon is less than half of one degree from Mars, indeed from Russia, Greenland and Iceland the Moon will pass in front of Mars or to be more precise, it will "occult" it.

If you're interested in "Chasing the Moon", then you can go to the National Astronomy Week website and download a map and instructions from https://astronomyweek.org. uk/resources/ The map is printable and includes spaces for you to draw in the phases of the Moon on all nine nights.

Despite the fact that the phases of the Moon are changing all the time it may surprise you to know that half of the Moon is always illuminated. The only thing that changes is the amount of that bright half that is turned towards us. At "new" the lit half is facing the Sun so the "dark" side of the Moon, or if you prefer, the side in shadow, is facing us making it invisible. There is one caveat to that statement which is that during a solar eclipse. we can see the dark body of the Moon passing in front of the Sun. By the way, don't forget that there is a partial eclipse of the Sun on March 29th. When the Moon is full, which occurs very roughly two weeks after new, the illuminated half faces us in its entirety.

Above I used the term "dark" to refer to the half of the Moon that receives no direct light, but this is not strictly correct because there is no permanently dark side. All of the Moon is illuminated in turn as it gradually revolves around the Earth over the course of approximately one month. It's true that the same face is always directed at us, but the same face isn't always directed towards the Sun.

There is around 50% of the Moon that we never see but that doesn't mean it never gets any sunlight. It is better to refer to that half of the Moon as the "far" side.

The map here shows the positions of the four naked eye planets (plus Uranus) currently visible in mid-February at 6:30pm. Star names are in italics whilst constellation names are in capitals.

### Tales from the Churchyard. Mr Thomas Francis. A Village family who has served the village over many generations



I have often wondered what was special about the men whose peers felt they were so special that they deserved to have a road named after them. Some of those who have their graves in our Churchyard have been honoured in this way. One such family judged to be worthy of this memorial to be a part of Hildenborough? With some it was wealth and status, but this was not the case with many, one such family who served the village for many generations was the Francis family.

Their story is that of the village through time. Through this family we can trace village history back to 1790. In that year the French Revolution was at its height and here George III was on the throne. The earliest record we have found is of Thomas Francis born on March 20<sup>th</sup> 1791, passed away in 1879 in his 90<sup>th</sup> year and was buried in St John's Churchyard.

Over the years he was to be joined by the graves of fourteen other members of the family. Thomas lived through the reigns of just 4 sovereigns and about 25 Prime Ministers. For most of those 89 years he had lived in the same house at Watts Cross that had belonged to the family since the 17th Century. At the time Thomas lived there it was called "Poplars" and is now called "The Cottage". It was a shop run by Thomas's wife Jane until it closed in 1881. Situated near the crossroads at

the heart of the original village it must have been a prime site getting traffic on the main road between Sevenoaks and Tonbridge and beyond. From about 1780 there were regular mail coaches along this road. The focus of the village moved when the new church of St John's was built in 1844: the building of the Church directly and indirectly affected the Francis family.

At the age of 19 he was called up into the Militia and joined the Tonbridge Troop of the Kentish Yeomanry. In 1815 he had the honour of bearing the Regiments colour when it went to Chatham to escort Louis XVIII on his way back to France after the proclamation of peace.

Thomas was active in church and village affairs throughout his life. He was Minister at the Wesleyan Chapel in Stocks Green Road which opened in 1826; during his time he started a Sunday School and maintained his association until the building was vacated by the church in 1844 when St John's church was built. He also took on the role of Church Warden at St John's church for several years. He served the village as an assessor and collector of Taxes as well as being the Parish Surveyor. His duties would have included collecting Highway Rates for Tonbridge Parish. His eldest son, also Thomas, was a cricket ball maker. His second son John was a councillor on the first parish council in 1894 and his grandson Edwin (Ted) also served on the parochial church council as well as being a sidesman and a member of the choir.

John was a founder member of the Gardeners' Society in 1896 and Ted also served as its chairman and in his time held many successful flower shows. Programmes and prize lists of the time show that the Francis family were keen gardeners.

Today we might consider any one of these roles sufficient to fill at the same time as earning a living. Life may have been slower but some managed to fill it to the full.



'Payrolling benefits in kind' means that employee benefits in kind (e.g. company cars and medical insurance) are reported to HMRC through the employer's payroll. Employees' tax codes are amended so that any income tax due on the benefits is paid throughout the tax year. If a benefit has been payrolled, it does not need to be included on form P11D.

Payrolling is possible for all benefits in kind, except for employer-provided living accommodation and beneficial (interest-free or low-interest) loans; these must still be reported on the P11D.

If an employer wishes to payroll benefits, they must register with HMRC before the start of the tax year in which they plan to start.

Regardless of whether benefits are included in the payroll or on a P11D, the employer must still include them in summary form P11D(b) and pay Class 1A National Insurance Contributions on the total taxable benefit value across the workforce. The deadline for filing the P11D(b) and paying the Class 1A NIC due is 6 July following the end of the tax year.

From 6 April 2026, payrolling benefits in kind will become mandatory for all employers for all benefits except for beneficial loans and living accommodation, although these will be able to be included in the payroll on a voluntary basis. It is hoped that this will bring simplification and clarity for employers and employees. As mentioned above, it is possible to choose to enter the regime one year early, from 6 April 2025, on a voluntary basis.
