## From the Church

When most people think of St John's, they picture our Sunday services—the singing, the prayers, the gathering of familiar faces

week by week. Many have visited the church for funerals and weddings. Yet outside our church doors lies another part of our parish's story, often unnoticed: our churchyard.

For over 180 years, the churchyard has been more than a resting place for the departed. It is a living witness to faith, community, and continuity across generations. Every headstone, every worn inscription, every moss-covered slab tells a story. These stones are not only monuments to individual lives but also markers of the enduring presence of the Church at the heart of this village.

Walking through the churchyard, one is struck by its beauty. In springtime, wildflowers scatter colour among the graves. In autumn, fallen leaves create a tapestry of gold and red over the paths. The natural cycle of the seasons reminds us that, even in death, God's creation sings of life and renewal. It is no wonder that many who visit our churchyard say they find there a sense of peace and sacred stillness.

But our churchyard is also part of the heritage of the whole community. Some of the memorials date back to the 19<sup>th</sup> Century, carrying names long forgotten by living relatives but not forgotten by God. This heritage is more than stone: it is a piece of parish history. It reminds us of the many people who have lived in the

village and the generations who built, sustained, and handed down the faith we now share.

Heritage projects across the country are beginning to recognise how valuable these sites are, not only to the Church but to local history. Churchyards are open-air museums, chronicling the lives of ordinary men and women alongside the prominent and respected. They speak of infant mortality, wars survived, and wars endured, of faith kept in difficult times, and of hope in resurrection.

For us at St John's, caring for our churchyard is not just maintenance; it is ministry. When we tend a grave, clear brambles, or polish a memorial, we are honouring both the past and the future. We are saying that this place matters, that those who went before us matter, and that their story is bound up with our own.

I would like to encourage you, next time you visit St John's, to linger in the churchyard. Read a name, say a prayer of thanks for a life lived, and allow yourself to be reminded of the great "cloud of witnesses" who surround us (Hebrews 12:1). Let the churchyard speak to you of faith that endures, hope that never fails, and love that connects generation to generation.

Our Sunday worship is the heartbeat of parish life. But our churchyard, standing quietly beside it, is the memory of the body. Together they tell a story: Christ with us in life, Christ with us in death, and Christ with us in the hope of resurrection.

songs from the Sound of Music (which is her favourite) and we all joined in with "Do-Re-Me", South Pacific and many



#### Hildenborough Cricket Club



Hildenborough Cricket Club went into the final month of the season on course for their most successful in the club's history.

At the time of writing they had won 12 of their 15 matches this season.

The latest victory over Petts Wood by 83 runs in late August was their eighth in a row - a sequence stretching back to mid-June.

Three batsmen - Richard Sparks (55), Mark Davies (52) and Greg Smith (51) all retired not out in a total of 219-3 in thirty-five overs.

Simon Clark then took three for eight and Matt Richards 2-25 in as the visitors ended on 136-9

Mark Davies' hundred was the highlight in a 23-run win over Kent Ramblas.

Back in action after a blank weekend due to opponents being unable to raise a side, they profited from another good all-round display. Davies led the way, reaching his ton off 89 balls with 14 fours and two sixes, before retiring supported by 48 not out from JP Martens in Hildenborough's total of 215-5.

Ramblas' reply started well, reaching 93-0, but Matt Richards checked their progress dismissing the top three batsmen.

Martens then held three catches before Richards Sparks (3-19 in five overs) and two by Tom Collier reduced the visitors to 192-7.

#### The Night Sky in Hildenborough – October 2025

Experience tells us that anything appearing in the media about astronomy is, in general, either vastly over exaggerated or vastly over simplified. One example of this is the regular hype we hear about "supermoons". It is true that because the Moon orbits the Earth in an ellipse, there are instances of a full Moon occurring when sometimes it is nearer and at other times further away from us. This obviously causes variations in the apparent size of the Moon but not to the wild extremes that the news would have us believe. It has to be remembered that a full Moon when viewed with foreground objects, such as houses and trees, always looks bigger thanks to an optical illusion. The proof of this is that when you look an hour or two after it has risen, and the Moon is clear of foreground objects, it has miraculously returned to its normal size.

This month there is a "Supermoon" on the 7<sup>th</sup> when our satellite will be 361,608½ km away. Full Moon occurs in the early morning at 4:48 am when it is about to set but if you look the evening before or the one after then you will get the same effect. Incidentally, on November 5<sup>th</sup> we will see this year's largest Supermoon which will be over 4,000 km closer than this month's. It will be the largest because full Moon coincides very nearly with "perigee", which is the point in its orbit when it is closest to Earth.

Saturn was at opposition towards the end of last month which is the time when it is closest to us and therefore larger and brighter. It is also the time when it is visible throughout the hours of darkness, rising as the Sun is setting. During the early part of the month, Saturn is close to the south east at an altitude of around 25°

at 9pm. Looking later in the night, and in the month, will mean the ringed planet is higher in the sky. If you are looking with binoculars or a telescope, the higher in the sky it is, the steadier the image should be because you are looking through a thinner layer of the atmosphere. However, do remember that whatever optical aid you are using, it will give substantially better views if it is mounted on a tripod or somehow supported. On the evening of the 5th, an almost full Moon is just 3° to the north west of Saturn.

On the night before, 4th October, NASA invites everyone to take part in "International Observe the Moon Night" where they encourage us all to observe our nearest celestial neighbour and take part in a number of activities. Go to https://moon.nasa.gov/observe-themoon-night/ to see what they have planned for budding astronomers.

It's hard to believe but it's 50 years ago this month since the first ever spacecraft from Earth touched down on another planet. Russia sent Venera 9 and 10 as a pair which seemed common in those days to overcome problems of unreliability. As it turned out, both craft made it to the surface of Venus and both transmitted data back (including a surface temperature of 485°C) to an orbiter which acted as a relay station to Earth.

If you're unlucky enough to have to get up at an unsocial hour, you might see Venus low down and due east around 6am in early October. Incidentally, the bright object considerably higher in the sky and towards the south east is the gas giant Jupiter. Venus is slowly moving back into the twilight so expect to see it getting closer to the horizon as time passes. By the end of October, it is much lower in the ESE at a similar time in the morning.

### T.M.B.C. News

#### Local Plan.

There is movement towards some crucial dates for the preparation of the local plan. Regulation 18: Second stage of consultation Q3 2025/26 (starting October 2025) and Regulation 19: Publication of the draft local plan Q2 2026/27. Sites put forward for development should be available to view. I would encourage anyone with an interest to view the TMBC website, go to 'Planning', then 'Planning Policy and Local Plan'.

Town Council.

For the Tonbridge part of Hildenborough Ward, the results are in for the consultation on Tonbridge gaining a Town Council. Now you might have heard that there was overwhelming support for a Town Council. Well, there was by the 12% (3,257) of Tonbridge residents who responded. 72% were in favour and 23% against, 5% did not know. Of the respondents, 53% learnt of the consultation by email, 31% by direct leaflet and 700 by word of mouth. For the no's the extra cost was a concern.

Tonbridge Town Regeneration.

Briefly 1,500 residents responded to the regeneration consultation, which I am told is a 'fair' response. There was support for Warders move to somewhere near to the rear of Sainsbury's and as much parking for the town as possible. Further work is being conducted on resident's responses.

New Angel Centre.

A concept design is being drawn up and of course the big question is, 'What goes inside'.

The design will be using the Royal Institute of British Architects rules. This is also being guided by 47 groups who book to use the present Angel Centre. Next September 2026, the Council will have to decide whether to proceed with the project. The Council will have to borrow money for construction. An

opening date sometime in 2028 is possible.

Task Force.

In Tonbridge visible patrolling has been enhanced by the addition of the Neighbourhood Task Force Town Team, which has added two police constables to the team and provided further resources. Unfortunately, regular patrols are required to deal with Anti-Social Behaviour at the Town Lock area, (Medway Wharf Road).

I have a strong desire for more buses serving our community. One of the ways you can ensure our bus services are as good as they can be is by letting me know any issues or concerns you may have. I am always interested to hear the experiences of anyone who uses our local bus routes, including our children.

That's why I run a School Bus Survey each year. With the new academic year having now started I have opened my 2025 survey to find out which services are working well, and which need improvement over the first few weeks of term. If you, or someone you know, has children of secondary school age, please ask them to complete my annual survey so they can have their say. I also would like to hear from anyone who has children of secondary school age who could get the bus to school but choose not to. Why is that, and what would make you consider getting a bus to school instead?

Autumn is always a tricky time for any parent, with our children going into a new school year and sometimes a new school entirely. This brings a change to the routine, and our travel plans too. With this being the case it's more important than ever to let me know your thoughts so that I can raise these with the relevant operators and Kent County Council. I meet regularly with our local bus companies, and I can raise these issues with them directly.

#### New Homes for Hildenborough

Does History repeat itself? Now and in 1945 the Government is looking for places to build large numbers of new homes. For some this may not be a welcome news story, but it was good news in 1945. After the bombing and rocket attacks on London there was a desperate need for new homes to be built quickly. It has been estimated that 1.1 million homes and flats were damaged or destroyed during the London Blitz of World War II.

Over much of Kent and the London suburbs were bomb sites that had once been homes. The problem was the same in many other cities. The houses had been demolished and buried in the rubble were unexploded bombs and human remains. It was going to take a long time to clear these sites for building. It would need skilled bomb disposal personnel and undertakers, and take too long to meet the urgent needs of the homecoming troops and the displaced Londoners.

The Government realised that the ideal solution would be to rebuild houses on the bomb sites to keep communities together. At the same time, they would need a skilled workforce but the skilled men were serving in the Forces. Added to this was a scarcity of some raw materials as so much had been used for the war effort. The answer then was a new method of construction that was quick and easy temporary building for the homeless from London and the suburbs.

The net was cast wider and in places like Hildenborough sites were considered to be suitable that may not have been looked at before. Hildenborough had the advantage of having sites where houses could be built as part of a community and where a new housing technique could be used. Part of this was answered by a Sevenoaks building firm (Jones & Harvey) who were experimenting with a new technique not requiring highly skilled workers.

The technique they adopted was based on their experience with hastily building "Pill Boxes". After Dunkirk, the nation needed to build robust defences to keep an invader at

bay. These "Pill Boxes" as they came to be called, were built of concrete poured into wooden shuttering using scrap for re-enforcing. They could be put up using unskilled labour to one basic design.

Many of these Pill Boxes are still standing along the Medway and other parts of Southern England. (There is one in Leigh Road.) It was decided that this same method would work for quick to build houses for families. These new "Craftcast" houses now needed a site where they could be built without delay.

The first thing that street only institute factors being the Tromes on entering the building was life of the physical. But when the street of the physical building was life of

Villages such as Hildenborough met some of the requirements of land that could be built on quickly using modern techniques in places we now know as Brookmead and Ashley Road.

These were also positive signs of the peace to come. After D-Day Plans were being made for the future. Discussions were taking place to build houses on land behind the

"Hilden Manor Roadhouse". (This is from an article in the local paper of 1944 with locations still disguised.). The original was built by ten men in only 24 days (typically it takes five to seven months to build a basic new home today). It was welcomed as being a totally flexible design, new owners could order the size and shape they required. The first to this new design are houses in Leigh Road at the end of Brookmead. Following the success of the prototype 220 houses were built. Some far sighted people were starting to look to the future. The design process was so quick that some units had long running problems. The technique also proved to be flexible and many of the original houses have had major modifications.

It was a fascinating talk from a man who is clearly passionate about bees and protecting them now and in the future.

Following Derek's talk, we stopped for tea and some lovely cake kindly provided by Jan.

We then shared general WI business and discussed forthcoming events and activities.

We were also joined by Becky Mackay who came along to talk to us about Tonbridge Harvest. We had a chat with her about some different avenues she could explore in order to develop her project, some of us also signed up for her and her team to come along and pick excess fruit we have in our gardens. Such a great idea.

Our next meeting is *Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> October 2025*, when we will share our Harvest supper.

The evening WI meets once a month and gives members the opportunity to meet new people, learn new skills, and have fun. We always welcome new members, so please feel free to just drop in and say hello, even just for one evening to see what we are all about.

Please note our meeting time, we meet in the family room at the Church Centre at <u>7.15pm</u> for a <u>7.30pm</u> start.







The High-Income Child Benefit Charge (HICBC)

From 7 April 2025, families receiving Child Benefit will see an increase in their payments. HM Revenue and Customs (HMRC) announced that the weekly rate will rise to £26.05 for the eldest or only child and £17.25 for each additional child. This means an annual payment of £1,354.60 for the first child and £897 for each subsequent child.

You may have to pay the HICBC if your income exceeds £60,000 and child benefit is being paid in relation to a child that lives with you, regardless of whether you are a parent of that child. If you are living with another person in a marriage, civil partnership or long-term relationship, you will only be liable to the HICBC if you are the higher earner of the two of you.

For 2025/26, the HICBC is calculated at 1% of the child benefit received for every £200 of income above £60,000. This means that child benefit is fully clawed back where income exceeds £80,000.

From summer 2025, if you are an employee who is liable to pay the HICBC, you will be able to use a new digital service to declare the charge and opt to pay it directly through PAYE, without the need to register for self-assessment.
