From the Church

The Lightbulb

There's a story told about Thomas Edison, that captures something of his

character. When Thomas Edison finally succeeded in creating the first practical lightbulb, it took a team of workers twenty-four straight hours to assemble it. A young assistant was given the honour of carrying the finished bulb upstairs to place it in the testing room — and promptly dropped it. The precious creation shattered on the steps.

Edison said nothing. Instead, he quietly began the process again. Twenty-four hours later, the team completed another bulb — and to everyone's amazement, Edison handed it to the same young man. That's grace: entrusting a person who might have felt shame and failure with light once more.

Christmas is the moment when God did the same for us. Humanity had dropped the bulb — smashed the light — yet God did not give up. He entrusted light to us again, not as an invention but as a person: "The true light that gives light to everyone was coming into the world" (John 1:9).

The world still feels dim at times — wars, divisions, loneliness, and headlines that seem to drain the brightness from life. But into that darkness, the birth of Jesus announces that light has not gone out. It shines quietly, persistently, and personally.

A lightbulb only fulfils its purpose when it's connected to the power source. You can polish it, admire it, or keep it safe in a box — but unless it's plugged in, it won't shine. In the same way, people often try to glow by their own effort — through success, appearance, or good deeds — but real spiritual light only flows when we're connected to the Source of all light: Jesus Christ.

And here's the thing about that light: it doesn't just illuminate our lives; it helps others find their way too. When a single candle is lit, it's beautiful — but when many candles are lit together, the whole room changes. That's what the Church is called to be — not perfect, but plugged in, shining together, pushing back the darkness in the world.

This Christmas, may you know the light that no darkness can extinguish. You may have dropped the bulb once or twice — we all have — but the grace of God still hands you the gift and says, "Here, try again. I love you and am here with you."

Jesus is the light that repairs what's broken, warms what's cold, and reveals what's true. And when His light is switched on in you, the world becomes a little brighter — one life at a time.



My name is Gabriele Drozd. I am married and have 2 daughters and 3 grandchildren. I have lived in Hildenborough since 1991 and have been worshipping at St. John's Church ever since.

I have been involved in various aspects of church life like taking part in a homegroup, serving refreshments, being a member of the welcoming team, singing in the choir and also doing some flower arranging for special church festivals.

The next big church celebration is going to be Christmas. The last 4 weeks before Christmas are called Advent which comes from the Latin word "adventus", meaning "arrival" or "coming". As Christians we are waiting for the arrival of Jesus Christ at his birth at Christmas.

The Advent Wreath is a tradition which originated in Germany and has become very popular in this country. And as I originally come from Germany, the leader of the flower team, who was very impressed by the large advent wreath she saw on a visit to Cologne Cathedral asked me about 25 years ago if I would like to make a German type advent wreath for our church, and that's what I have done almost every year ever since.

Obviously, my version is much smaller. There are 4 candles on the wreath itself, symbolising in the German tradition hope, peace, joy, and love. The first candle is lit on the first Sunday in Advent and then another one subsequently each Sunday, as we are waiting for the arrival of Jesus Christ. The 5th candle in the centre is lit at Christmas to symbolise the light Jesus has brought to the world with his birth.

The TMBC Local Plan - it matters to you too At a meeting in the Village Hall on Friday 14th November, Matt Boughton, leader of TMBC, gave a presentation describing the Regulation 18 situation, explaining how important it was for TMBC to receive personal inputs from villagers. TMBC have to formulate a plan to deliver over 19000 new houses in the borough by 2042, and up to 1000 are earmarked for Hildenborough. This is a government mandate, and TMBC cannot refuse to comply, otherwise planning decisions will be made by personnel totally unconnected with the local area. TMBC will have posted papers to all

villagers by the time you read this, and it is imperative that you respond if you feel strongly about any matters. It is not enough to just say that your countryside view will be taken away – that cuts no ice with planning law. Matters such as schooling, medical facilities, transport, roads, etc. should be part of your concerns, and every person that responds adds weight to any argument against undesirable features in the plan. The future of the village is not known, but you could help to shape the way it does change – and it will. It's up to you now.

Hildenborough Medical Practice Update

Readers will no doubt be aware that the Hildenborough and Trenchwood Surgeries have recently introduced a new appointment booking system called 'ANIMA'.

The Surgery's Patient Participation Group (PPG) are keen to support the Practice with this new system as it promises new benefits for patients. The new system was introduced as the previous system had resulted in up to 3 week waits for appointments and increasing patient frustration.

The new 'ANIMA' system was introduced in mid-June and since then the 3-week waits have reduced to as much as 3 days. The 'ANIMA' system involves filling out an online form; and help is available from the Care Navigators on the telephone to assist you to complete it as necessary.

As with any new system it has had its teething problems. These however are now reducing, and the new system is showing real benefits for patient care.


TMBC Local Plan. - The Local Plan consultation opened for responses on 10th November, <u>it will run until</u> 02 January 2026.

I would urge you to view the plan online via the TMBC website or the hard copies held at Tonbridge Castle Council offices. Responses can be Emailed or handwritten and sent to council.local.plan@tmbc. gov.uk

There will be a further consultation in Summer 2026, before submitting the Local Plan to the Planning Inspectorate for Examination by December 2026.

Securing a Local Plan is the single most important step Tonbridge and Malling Borough Council will make this decade, to safeguard and control the future of our borough. It's a decision members want to make jointly with everyone who cares about Tonbridge and Malling Borough. The plan's central objective is to deliver approximately 19,000 new homes over the next 18 years - a target set by the Government. This must be done, while minimizing the impact on Greenfield areas, delivering environmental improvements and preserving the character of our towns and villages. Delivering a Local Plan is the only way to meet these multiple challenges. Without a plan, we face a free-for-all in which developers can submit applications to build almost anywhere. Even when we refuse planning permission, applicants may well win on appeal because there is no Local Plan in place to steer development towards areas where it can be accommodated and is sustainable.

So, what's in the plan more locally?



For Hildenborough and Tonbridge the brown shaded areas are proposed housing allocations.

HI-1. Riding Park 77 houses. HI-2. Stocks Green Road 629 houses.

TO-3. Hilden Farm 30 houses. TO-4. Land to North of Brookmead 289 houses. And for Tonbridge TO-1. Greentrees near golf course 1,671 houses. TO-2. Coblands, end of Trench Road 294 houses and TO-5. Haysden 423 houses. These are the major allocations.

Why TO-3 and TO-4 are annotated that way and not included in Hildenborough is to do with settlement, so I am informed.

Please take time to view and comment on the local plan.

Tonbridge Town Council - The Tonbridge Town Council consultation is live until the 12th December, via the TMBC website or at the Castle Council Offices.

You will doubtless have seen a great deal of discussion about the TMBC Local Plan. TMBC does not currently have an adopted Local Plan because the version produced by the last administration in 2017 was rejected due to failure to cooperate with neighbouring councils.

National planning rules changed in 2024, increasing housing targets with the effect that TMBC must now produce planning for 19,746 new homes. The council is now consulting on a new draft plan (Regulation 18 stage), open from 10 November to 22 December 2025.

The purpose of a Local Plan is to:

Guide development until 2042.

Meet government housing targets (19,746 homes).

Protect the environment and manage infrastructure.

Provide legal weight to planning decisions. Proposals for areas outside of the Local Plan can be denied more easily.

Without a Local Plan, developers can build in unsuitable areas. Anywhere at all, within the borough. The council will have limited power to refuse applications. Infrastructure and environmental protections weaken.

Many view the current proposals as controversial because TMBC proposes releasing 404 hectares of Green Belt land for housing and employment. Many areas previously classified as Green Belt are being reclassified as so-called "Grey Belt". This includes areas near Hildenborough, such as land north and west of the village and near Tonbridge. Green Belt release requires 'exceptional circumstances' under national policy.

You may feel that we are better off with this Local Plan, since it offers a degree of protection to other areas. However, should you wish to object during the consultation period, there are several things you can do, including:

Visiting TMBC's Local Plan portal: https://www.tmbc.gov.uk/localplan.


Submitting a formal objection with planning-based reasons (e.g., harm to openness, biodiversity, infrastructure strain). It is really important that reasons are clear, relevant and justified.

Referring to specific sites or parcels (e.g., Appendix H for Hildenborough).

Challenging the justification for Green Belt release. Are the circumstances sufficiently exceptional?

I hope you agree with me that this is a serious issue that will strongly affect our local area. Personally, I feel Hildenborough will be disproportionately affected by this plan. Please take the time to use the Local Plan Portal and have your say.

From our MP: Tom Tugendhat

Until Thursday 2 January 2026, Tonbridge and Malling Borough Council (TMBC) are consulting on its Draft Local Plan. This is the document which sets out where houses should be built in our community, until the 2040s.

The task for the Council is so much harder than ever before. That's because the Government have increased the housing target for TMBC by around 34%, instructing our Council to find land for nearly 20,000 new homes across this period. I feel for TMBC who have been given no choice and have pushed back against the Government on these housing targets given the constraints on infrastructure.

I did not support these changes in Parliament and have voted against the Government on its planning policy, including the new 'grey belt' definition. When I joined with other MPs to prevent towns and villages being able to merge by protecting the land between them, the Government voted against this.

Grey belt is an especially challenging policy for our area because it effectively takes all land immediately adjacent to towns and villages out of the green belt, if it meets the 'golden rules', which most developers say their land is able to.

In our community it means development of over 1,000 homes comes forward within Hildenborough parish. The majority of these are at parcels of land between B245 and Stocks Green Road, but there are also sites north of B245, including between Woodfield Avenue and Hill View Road.

It is therefore critical we have our say directly to TMBC before the consultation closes on 2 January 2026. I have created a dedicated page on my website with all the information, including links on how to respond. You can visit this at

The Night Sky - December

Astronomy, as in many other activities in life, requires a number of things to work all at once in order to achieve success. Nobody is better placed to comment on such things than an astronomer!

Of course, the first problem is that it has to be clear or there's no point in going any further. Beyond that, in most cases, the sky has to be dark to see anything meaningful which is where the next issue arises. Because, unless you happen to be a lunar observer, the Moon is best when it's out of the way. Such is the case for the Geminid meteor shower this year which is active from 4th December until the 17th with maximum activity occurring on the night of the 13th/14th. Anyone who looked last year was severely hampered by an almost full Moon "next door" to Taurus. This year the outlook is better with a waning crescent Moon not rising until 2:30am when I'm guessing most people will be tucked up in a warm bed.

The Geminids is the year's strongest shower in terms of the number of meteors per hour that we expect to see at peak activity. The Perseids, in August, receive enhanced media coverage because they are much more likely to attract casual viewers on warm summer evenings whereas cold winter nights require a tougher kind of observer!

The reason that we see meteor showers at regular times of the year is thanks to comets and, in the case of the Geminids, an

asteroid as they pass around the solar system on highly elliptical orbits. Each time a comet or asteroid passes the Sun some of it vapourises and small particles are released which then form a trail of debris through which the Earth passes on a yearly basis. These particles collide with the Earth's atmosphere

and "burn up" though that isn't entirely the correct terminology.

The Geminids are so called because the point in the sky that the meteors appear to radiate from (the "radiant") is located in the constellation Gemini, the celestial twins. They seem to originate from one point in the same way that snowflakes do if you're driving in a car when it's snowing or if you see railway tracks converging into the distance. In general terms it's better to look later at night when the radiant is higher which means not only is there more chance of seeing meteors that are travelling south, towards the horizon, but air and light pollution away from the horizon will be less. Also, if you watch after midnight, numbers should be higher because the Earth, as it rotates, is turning to meet the particles head-on.

So, if the weather plays ball for us on the night of the 13th/14th we can expect to see perhaps one meteor every 3 or 4 minutes. Geminids are slow moving and often bright with many having a subtle yellow hue. It's best to meteor watch lying on a sun lounger with the head end raised slightly – viewing from the standing position plays havoc with the neck! Point yourself either towards the Plough in the north east or Orion/Taurus in the south east but you don't need to look directly at the radiant as meteors tend to be shorter there. In the map the radiant is shown as a black "R" on a white circle. Constellation names are in regular text whilst star names are in italics. The position of Jupiter is also shown.



Sustainable Christmas Craft: Homemade Salt Dough Decorations

Why it's sustainable:

Uses simple kitchen ingredients, no plastic, and can be composted after use — or treasured for years!

You'll need:

- 2 cups plain flour
- 1 cup salt
- 3/4 cup warm water
- (Optional: natural food colouring, cinnamon, or essential oils for scent)

Instructions:

- Mix the flour and salt together in a bowl.
- Add water gradually, stirring until it forms a dough.
- Knead for 5-10 minutes until smooth.
- Roll out to about ½ cm thick and cut into festive shapes using cookie cutters.

- Use a straw to make a small hole for hanging.
- 6. Bake at a low heat (around 120°C / 250°F) for 2–3 hours, or until hard and dry.
- Once cool, decorate with water-based paints or natural dyes, and seal with a dab of eco-friendly varnish if you'd like them to last longer.

Tip: Tie them with twine or ribbon from last year's wrapping for a rustic, zerowaste finish





HMHC's online service to pay the High Income Child Benefit Charge (HICBC) through Pay As You Earn (PAYE) is now live. The service was announced at the Spring Statement 2025 and aims to reduce the need for some taxpayers to complete self assessment solely to settle the charge.

HICBC applies where the claimant or their partner has adjusted net income above the threshold. From the 2024/25 tax year, the threshold is £60,000, with child benefit fully withdrawn at £60,000. The clawback is 1% of the benefit for every £200 income over £60,000.

Previously, HICBC payers reported the charge via self

assessment, with limited coding-out through PAYE for amounts under £2,000. Under the new approach, PAYE taxpayers who only file a return to pay HICBC can opt out of self assessment and pay via PAYE instead. To use the service, individuals must first de-register from self assessment; access should be available the following day.

HMRC plans to write to around 100,000 people who appear liable but are not in self assessment. Households can also opt out of receiving child benefit payments. Registration can still be beneficial, however, as it provides National Insurance credits for non-working parents and triggers a child's NI number before age 16.
