From the Church

The turning of a year is a strange thing.

Nothing visibly changes overnight

and yet everything feels different. A new number on the calendar carries expectation, pressure, and possibility all at once. January can feel like a starting line, even if we're not entirely sure where the race is heading.

Many people begin the year by asking, "What do I want to change?" The Christian faith gently asks a different question: "Who am I becoming?" Becoming is a slower word. It allows room for learning, mistakes, and growth. It recognises that life is not a straight line, but a journey shaped by setbacks as well as successes. One of the great Christian truths is that God works patiently. Not rushing people into perfection but shaping them over time. This is good news for anyone who enters January tired, uncertain, or carrying regrets from the year before. We live in a culture that celebrates instant results. But faith, like character, develops gradually through small choices made consistently. Showing up when it would be easier to withdraw. Speaking truth with love. Choosing to hope.

Jesus never pressured people into immediate transformation. He invited them to follow step by step, day by day. And following, by definition, assumes movement rather than arrival.

We may not know what this year will hold. But the Christian faith insists that meaning is not found only at the destination, but in the walking itself.

Perhaps this year doesn't need a grand resolution. Perhaps it needs attention to what matters, to who matters.

The year ahead is not a test to pass, but a journey to live. The New Testament reminds us "Being confident of this, that he who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus." Philippians 1:6

And wherever you find yourself on that journey, the invitation remains the same: keep walking, keep becoming, and trust that something good is still being shaped. God is not distant or demanding, watching from the sidelines with a checklist. Rather, He is present, attentive, and deeply invested in who we are becoming. Yet God's work in a person's life is not simply about directing events from the outside. It is about shaping them from the inside. True growth does not begin with changed circumstances, but with a transformed heart — with deeper character, clearer values, and a growing sense of meaning and direction. God does not force a path upon us. Instead, He walks with us, encouraging, strengthening, and gently guiding as we navigate life's choices and challenges.

In that sense, He is not a critic waiting for failure, but a quiet encourager — urging us on, reminding us of our worth, and calling out the potential He has always seen in us. To pay attention to the inner life as much as the outer one.

To trust that God is at work beneath the surface — shaping, strengthening, and drawing us toward the person we were always created to be.

Kent Fraud Alert System

Crypto Investment scams - Investment scammers stole more than £97 million of savers' cash in the first half of 2025, according to industry body UK Finance. We have recently seen an increase in reports.

How does it work? The victim is contacted to invest in a fake crypto currency. The offenders will be very convincing and will provide you access to an online platform to monitor your investments, however it is all a scam, as when you ask to remove part of your investment, they will ask you to pay an additional fee in order to release either all or part of your money and will continue to request more fees. Once the victim realises it is a scam, the criminals then break all contact. If you are asked to pay money to release an investment, STOP and report it. You can call *Report Fraud* on 0300 123 2040. You can also contact your bank immediately by dialling 159.

Police Impersonation Scam – Courier fraud.

We have received reports of criminals calling residents in Tonbridge, Romney Marsh and Margate impersonating police officers. Residents are being called and told:

- Their bank account has been compromised.
- Their card needs replacing
- A family member has been arrested.
- They must buy gold - A courier will collect their card, cash, or gold.

These are scams. The police will never ask for your financial details over the phone or send someone to collect your card, cash, or valuables.

The Night Sky - January

The beginning of a new year is probably a good time for people to look ahead and see what goodies it promises and, in that respect, astronomers are no different. Of course, many of the things we look at require a degree of optical assistance but that's of little use to the general public. What they are interested in, and want to know about, are the sort of events where the naked eye is all that's needed.

Have you ever seen Mercury? Not many people have. There is a reasonable chance to see it in the evenings in mid-February and again in the middle of June when the brilliant "Evening Star", Venus, is also visible.

Jupiter rules the evening skies for those of us in the northern hemisphere, and that will be the case from January until early June. The other "gas giant" Saturn, puts on a good show from late September now that the tilt of its ring system is displaying the underside of the rings to better effect.

What will most likely grab the attention of the general public though is an eclipse of the Sun on 12th August when 91% of the Sun will be obscured. Then on the 28th of the same month it's the turn of the Moon to be eclipsed when 93% of it will move into the earth's shadow. It isn't all good news because that event doesn't begin until 3:30am and ends when the Moon sets at 6:10am with the eclipse still in progress.

If you enjoy meteor watching then the Perseid meteor shower in August reaches its peak on the night of the 12th/13th that rather conveniently coincides with a new Moon which will be a big improvement on the 85% Moon which rather spoiled the 2025 display.

The other high activity shower is the Geminids which peaks on the night of 13th/14th December. In fact, recent data suggests that activity is actually increasing year by year so the fact that in 2026 the slim waxing crescent Moon will have set by 8pm should encourage even casual watchers to take a look.

That's all about the future but what about the here and now? Of course, in January, we see the brilliant winter constellations that are generally clustered around Orion, "The Hunter" which lies in the south east at 8pm in the middle of the month. The three stars which make up Orion's belt make him easily identifiable. If you draw a line through the stars of the belt and down towards the horizon, you'll reach Sirius, the brightest star in the night sky. A line through the belt and upwards will pass close to another bright star, Aldebaran, in Taurus the bull. Continuing that line north will bring you near to the Pleiades cluster otherwise known as the "Seven Sisters". See how many you can spot after your eyes have become dark adapted. The brilliant object that sits some twenty-five to thirty degrees to the east (left) of Orion is the planet Jupiter which is currently found among the stars of Gemini, the twins. The two bright stars a little to the east of Jupiter signify the Twin's (Castor and Pollux's) heads.

If you want to see Orion and his retinue at their best then if you look at 10pm in mid-January, he will be due south and at his greatest elevation. Alternatively, if you wait until the middle of next month, the hunter will be in exactly the same position at 8pm.

On the 10th January, Jupiter will be at its closest to Earth, something that astronomers refer to as "opposition" because the planet lies opposite the Sun in the sky. Being at its closest means it appears at its brightest and largest. Have a look for the four Galilean moons even if you only have binoculars.

The Quadrantid meteor shower is brief with activity centred on the night of 3rd/4th January. Meteors appear to radiate from close to the end of the handle of the plough and can reach high numbers in the right conditions. The downside this year is that a full Moon is in nearby Gemini although watch out for the brighter meteors that very often leave an ionised "train" behind them for a few seconds.

T.M.B.C. News

May I take this opportunity to wish all Hildenborough residents and businesses a Very Happy New Year.

TMBC Local Plan.

The Local Plan consultation closed for responses on 02 January. On the TMBC website there are extensive details for the progression of the local plan, including Regulation 19, Publication of the Pre-Submission LP due Q2 26/27 and Regulation 20 Consultation of the Pre-Submission LP due Q2 26/27. The timetable TMBC is working to suggest a sub-mission of the plan to the Secretary of State by 12 December 2026.

The plan's central objective is to deliver approximately 19,000 new homes across the Borough over the next 18 years - a target set by the Government. This must be done, while minimizing the impact on Greenfield areas, delivering environmental improvements and preserving the character of our towns and villages.

Air Quality.

Good news on air quality in Tonbridge High Street, pollution levels have been in decline for a number of years and are well below the 10% of the annual objective for Nitrogen Dioxide. There are numerous reasons for this continual drop, working at home, start/stop cars, Hybrid and Electric cars.

Parish Council.

I attended the last full Parish Council meeting for the year in December. I would like to offer my grateful thanks for all the work undertaken by Parish Councillors during 2025 for residents and businesses in Hildenborough.

Planning Department.

The planning department at TMBC was subjected to a Planning Peer Challenge last September. All members were given the opportunity to input into the review via the Area Planning groups. The report of the review runs to 22 pages and there are 14 key recommendations. From our MP: Tom Tugendhat

The Rt Hon Sir John Stanley, who served our community for 41 years, has died at the age of 83 following a short illness.

Sir John served Tonbridge and Malling as MP between 1974 and 2015. He dedicated much of his life to our concerns and cared deeply. I have learned so much from so many who have shared stories of his dedication to responding to those who needed his help.

Sir John was known in Parliament for the way he articulated the case for greater flood protection for our village. Early on in his tenure he persuaded what was then the Southern Water Authority to introduce the River Medway (Flood Relief) Act 1976, which led to the construction of the Leigh Flood Storage Area off Powder Mill Lane. To this day we know how that has helped protect much of our community from the worst effects of flooding, and the current works to strengthen the embankment alongside the expansion of the Flood Storage Area are only possible because of the Act of Parliament he helped introduce in 1976.

He also served with distinction in Parliament on the Foreign Affairs Committee and as a minister in government. Sir John had the privilege, as Margaret Thatcher's PPS, of being the one who welcomed her into Number 10 for the first time. He went on to bring through the law allowing council tenants

to buy their homes, the biggest transfer of wealth in a generation.

From there he went on to serve as the Minister for the Armed Forces in the Ministry of Defence and later as a minister in the Northern Ireland Office. His unique style brought change and focus to each role. He served our country with distinction.

Even after he stepped down, he was a kind friend and counsel to me and was the best predecessor I could ask for. No issue was too big or small for Sir John to deal with. In Parliament, he was devoted to serving his country in the same way he served our community.

I know I will not be alone in missing Sir John, he helped many of us in Kent, and across the United Kingdom. His life was one of dedication and service. I send my deepest condolences to Elizabeth and to his whole family.

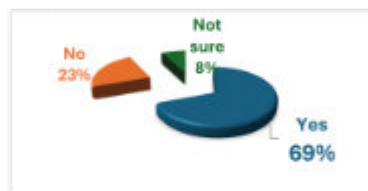

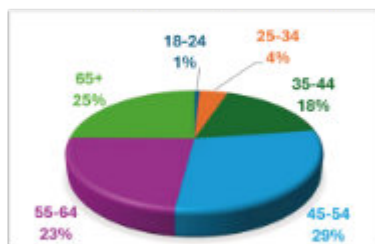

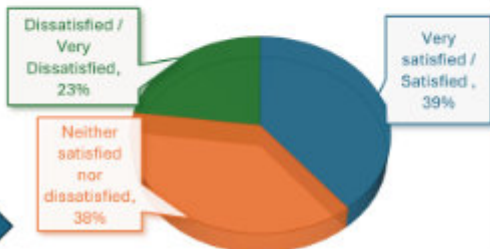
Age range of responders

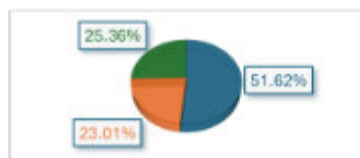

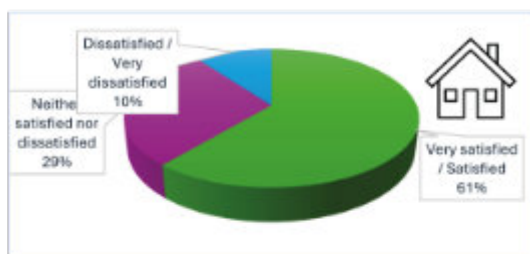


Feedback on public transport in Hildenborough was evenly divided, showing no clear consensus among residents.

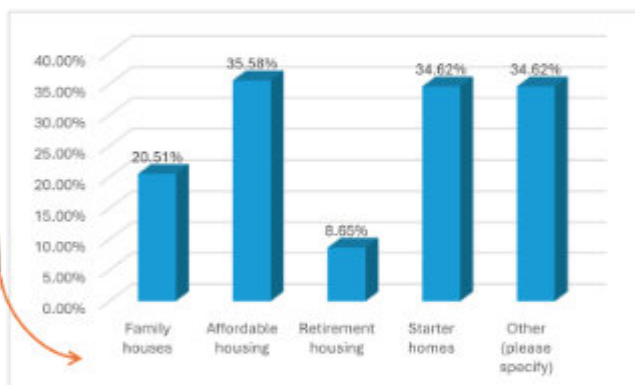




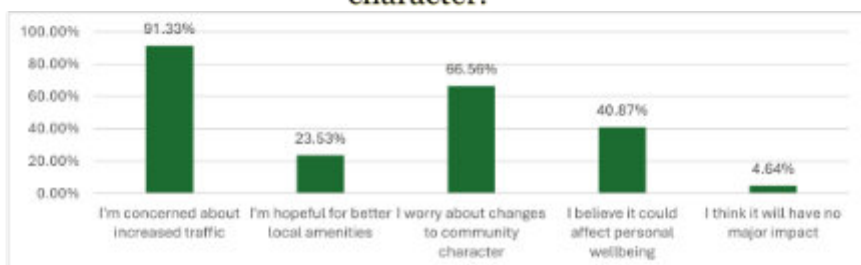
